I'm Gary Bauer for Washington Watch.

Last week, during one of my speaking tours, I happened to be near the small town of Union, South Carolina. The sense of tragedy hung like a dark cloud over that picturesque rural community, where Susan Smith now awaits trial for the murder of her two children, Michael and Alexander. How could such a thing happen?

I don't claim to have all the answers. I don't claim to know why, week in and week out, we receive news in this country of some crime — committed against children, and by children — that is more horrible than anything we've heard before. A five-year-old child tossed to his death from a Chicago high-rise, a woman dragged to death trying to stop the hijacking of a car with her baby still strapped to the inside. Violence in our culture has become so ordinary that the media bother to report only the worst examples — and they're never in short supply.

No, I don't claim to know all the answers. But I do know this. Individuals are finally responsible for their acts, but the character of our culture makes a difference too. And that character, as millions of Americans have told the pollsters, is going in the wrong direction. For years, we have been told that the highest aim in life is self-fulfillment, to do your own thing. That our personal happiness and freedom makes us sovereign over the very lives of our unborn children. Now the ghosts of these ideas are haunting us.
