According to Army Regulation AR-848-18, Oct. 1, 1979, "the Flag is trimmed on three sides with Fringe of Gold, 2 1/2 in. wide." Also, "such flags are flown indoors, ONLY in military courtrooms." Further, "the Gold fringed Flag is not to be carried by anyone except units of the United States Army, and units of the United States Army division associations." (--THE AMERICAN JURAL SOCIETY HANDBOOK, p. 68, 1995. Emphasis in this reference.)

Thus, fringed flags in civilian courts are direct and conclusive evidences that the courts are not Art. III courts, under the Supreme Court, but rather Article I courts, under the legislative and executive aegis, dealing with administrative and commercial aspects only.

This means that the executive is encroaching upon the judicial power.

The courts are really military courts-martial, under martial rule. Thus, the courts transcend and violate the separation of powers doctrine. They are not truly courts of law but tribunals of dictatorship. The "judge" merely administers the law as an administrative hearing officer.

The "judge" and the "prosecutor" are both on the same side, under Article I, and against the accused.

Another factor placing them on the same side is their both receiving payment from the State, the same master.

Yet another is the fact that both pay income taxes, kickbacks; again to the same master.

Chief Justice Taney of the Supreme Court sent a letter of protest to the Secretary of the Treasury (157 U.S. 781) in 1863 when the law was passed requiring the kickbacks. (--IRS HUMBUG, by Frank Kowalik, 1991, p. 21.)

They still exist today, known as Income Tax.
