

SCHOOLS AND EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH

Many of the Commission programs and presentations in 1983 involved Archdiocesan schools. Curriculum aides on the Pastoral Letter were made available through the Commission, and several appearances or programs involved Commission Members and Staff at schools.

In December, several Commission Members led workshops at an all-day event held at Bishop Walsh High School, entitled, "Hunger for Justice Day." The program featured an opening Liturgy celebrated by Bishop P. Francis Murphy which was devoted to themes in the Pastoral Letter. The Liturgy was followed by many workshops on different topics, repeated several times in the day. Commission Members or staff featured were: Chuck Michaels (The Poor and the Law), Catherine Gugerty (Feeding the Poor), and Sr. Mary Louise Lynch. MMS (Nicaragua).

In early March of 1984, Notre Dame Preparatory School held a "Peace Fair" which featured workshops from invited speakers and school faculty. Commission Member Jeanne Noble and Coordinator Chuck Michaels co-presented "Dreaming Your Dream of Peace" with the assistance of Bob McCarty of Youth Ministries.

Other school presentations included a videotape made at Catholic High School to be distributed to other schools of the Franciscan Order on the east coast. The program was a panel discussion on practical points of peace and justice education featuring Dick Ullrich and Commission Member Br. Kirby Boone, CFX, Principal of Mount St. Joseph High School.

Additional speaking engagements involved: Mercy High, Catholic High, Archbishop Keough High, Mount St. Marys College, St. Thomas More School, Notre Dame Preparatory School (program on Pastoral for parents and a study afternoon for faculty) and Loyola High School.

INVOLVEMENT WITH ARCHDIOCESAN DEPARTMENTS AND COUNCILS

In 1983 the Commission continued its cooperative efforts with departments and divisions of Central Services and with other Archdiocesan agencies on issues of
