

On top there will be constructed a watchtower effect similar to that on top of the Brooklyn Bethel home. Already the New World society printing plant makes a striking appearance on the Brooklyn skyline. But when the new factory is finished it will be much more so; when viewed from downtown Brooklyn it will stretch from the entrance of the Brooklyn bridge all the way to the entrance of the Manhattan bridge. Floor space of the new building will be 30,000 square feet more than the 160,000 square feet in the present factory. Connecting the two factories will be a passageway over the street at the 6th floor. New printing presses are scheduled to arrive in May or June. Readers of The Watchtower and Awake! will be glad to know that the new factory, when completed and equipped, will have a tremendous potential: capacity for printing a million magazines a day!
