\$35.00: A House Divided

Rep. Pat Swindall, the author of *A House Divided*, spoke at American Vision's second annual "Inner Circle Banquet." He won re-election to Georgia's 4th-district in 1986. In this book Pat gets down to the issues in a way that I wish every Congressman would. There is no rhetoric or fooling around here. The issues are presented, the facts are marshalled, and the implications are spelled out. This is a great book to give to a friend who just doesn't know what to make of you "mixing religion and politics." Pat deals with the justice system, the abortion issue, the national debt and continuing annual deficits, the mediocrity in public education, the radicalization of the First Amendment, and growing welfare dependency.

The subtitle to this book is *The Use of Force, Nuclear Weapons, and Our Conscience*. The issue of nuclear weapons is a difficult one. But what does the Bible say and what can we hope to realize in this sin-scarred world? This is the first book that I've seen that addresses the issues honestly and realistically.

This is the first full-length Life of Jonathan Edwards to appear in fifty years. Edwards was a significant figure in America's early years. He is recognized as the greatest intellectual figure in 18th-century America. Edwards was President of the college of New Jersey (later Princeton). This is a wonderful book. Iain Murray is a masterful biographer. This is a beautifully bound book. You will treasure it for years.
