

departments of economics and schools of business. A growing interest on the part of teachers from the Humanities is found and candidates from English, History, and other departments were placed. Seven of the total number of candidates placed were women.

From the applications received, recommendations are made by the Foundation to business firms. But, since the Foundation acts only in a liaison capacity, *the final approval of candidates for fellowships rests with the business firms.*

Applications for fellowships must be received at the Foundation not later than February 15, 1954. Inquiries should be addressed to Dr. W. M. Curtiss, Foundation for Economic Education, Irvington-on-Hudson, New York.

Final awards will be made by April 1, 1954.
