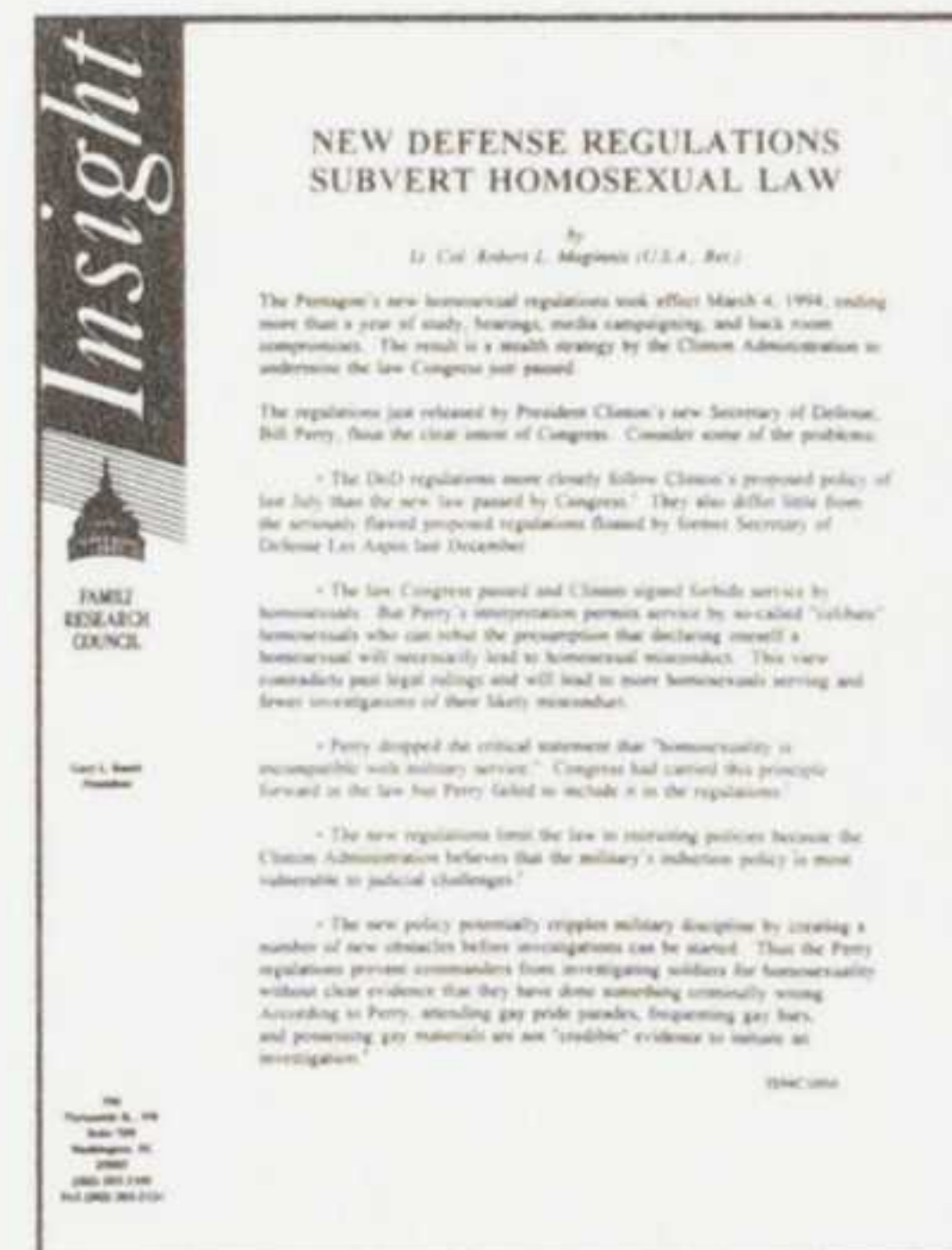

Breaking the Rules

Gay Pride Week 1996. A contingent of U.S. soldiers in civilian clothes marches at the head of the parade. A city's most notorious homosexual nightclub. Navy personnel frequent it on their off-duty hours. An airman keeps a stack of homosexual magazines and pin ups in his barracks room. Actions that once would have invited investigation now have official approval – thanks to new rules issued by the Clinton Pentagon that undercut the military's longstanding ban on homosexuality.

Retired Army Lt. Colonel Bob Maginnis takes apart the new Clinton rules on homosexuality in uniform and shows how they undercut and betray the intent of the law Congress adopted only last year.
