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Raising the Curtain: A Guide to Independent Organizations and Contacts in Eastern Europe, updated as of December 1989, describes more than 200 independent groups concerned with issues ranging from politics to art, peace to publishing, civil rights to ecology, and including labor, religion, charitable activity, and historic preservation. Where possible, names, addresses and telephone numbers of leading figures or contact persons are given. This edition, approximately 75 pages long, includes independent organizations of the Baltic republics of Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania.

Additionally, *Raising the Curtain* describes fifty organizations in the U.S. and Western Europe concerned with East European affairs—important sources of further information and contacts—and provides an annotated guide to periodicals, essays and books about the region.

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
