

II. More democracy... in elections

- Institute automatic voter registration.
- Take the money out of politics by:
 - a. Establishing public financing of campaigns.
 - b. Setting maximum spending figures for candidates.
 - c. Requiring strict disclosure of all campaign contributions.
 - d. Prohibiting corporations from contributing to any type of local, state, or federal election, including general election, primary, initiative, recall, and referendum.
- Eliminate filing fees for elections.
- Require that public officials be elected from the smallest practicable units—that is, from wards rather than at-large, from single-member districts rather than multi-member districts, etc.

III. More democracy... in the government

- Require recall, referendum, and initiative provisions at all levels of government.
- Require that low and moderate income people be proportionally represented in all major political institutions, including: the Cabinet, the judiciary, the regulatory boards, and the national party conventions.

- Select the members of government regulatory boards by direct popular election.
- Require government offices to be open on evenings and on Saturdays so that working people have access to them.
- Limit the salaries of public officials to no more than the average income of their districts.
- Compensate citizens who serve on public boards and commissions, testify at utility hearings, or represent the public in other ways for their time and expenses—as with jury duty.
- Eliminate the electoral college, so that the president and vice-president will be elected directly by the people.

IV. More democracy... in big business

- Require all corporations of over \$10 million in assets to include worker representatives and low and moderate income members of the community on their corporate boards.
- Require the news media to provide equal access to low and moderate income people.
- Expand the organizing and collective representation rights of workers, farmers, tenants, consumers, and communities in their confrontations with business corporations.
