Our experience has shown that film can be a great educator and stimulator and that this effect is heightened by sharing reactions, analyses and responses with others who have just seen the film. So we have put together Angry Arts, a group of people who will be presenting films in the Redbook basement. Angry Arts hopes to facilitate lively discussions following the films by providing a non-intimidating, informal atmosphere. Perhaps we will get into music and improvisational theater.

Angry Arts idea is to make going to the movies a more complete experience, not just a private viewing in the dark, but more a chance to spend time with friends, to be exposed to new ideas, to exchange bits of part history and personal outlooks. We will be showing films that show aspects of struggles against racism, sexism and capitalism. In planning our programs we hope to work collectively with people doing actual organizing so that the films we choose are those that address themselves to problems of current interest. In addition, we want to work closely with organizing groups because we see the Angry Arts events as an opportunity for friends to spend time together away from work or the hassles of the day. (It's easier to bring people to a film than to a demonstration.)

We will be showing films on Thursdays and Fridays. Tickets for Thursday night will only be available through groups. Friday night tickets will be available both through groups and general sales.
