

well received, and the programs drew a combined attendance of more than 200 Archdiocesan teachers, to learn about the Peace Pastoral and reflect on its impact in their own work. Commission Co-Chair Dick Ullrich led a workshop on "the Commission as a resource."

Commission outreach to "multipliers" also included informal sessions with priests, at four area priest meetings: North West Urban, South West Suburban, North East Rural and North East Suburban. These meetings featured frank and open discussions between parish pastors and Commission Members or Staff about the issues of peace and peacemaking at the parish level, and how the Commission can be of service in dealing with those issues.

Additional involvements came through presentations on the Peace Pastoral to faculty of elementary or high schools for school "inservice days." These presentations were in addition to the all-day seminar series already mentioned, and underscored the importance of the Peace Pastoral as a document for attention in school settings. These presentations were made at St. Clement/Rosedale, St. Matthew School in Baltimore and St. John School in Severna Park.

The Commission's efforts to reach another important component of "multipliers" on the issue of the Peace Pastoral--the deacons--was significantly advanced with a full-day program given in March. That program was followed by a four-evening series and a question-and-answer booklet. These programs provided an important source of interaction between the Commission and the Archdiocesan deacon community on a critical subject of parish concern and ministry: the issues in the Peace Pastoral. The programs were the result of work by Deacon Staff Associate Joseph Jensen, who interned with the Commission for the first six months of 1984 and was later appointed to the Commission as past of his deacon pastoral assignment in the Archdiocese.

The March full-day program for Archdiocesan deacons and pastoral associates featured presentations by Fr. Schindler and by Fr. William Au of the Commission, as well as group discussions on the Peace Pastoral and the ministry of the deacon or pastoral associate. Bishop P. Francis Murphy offered his comments and Deacon Program Coordinator Rev. Art Bastress also addressed the deacons on the importance of
