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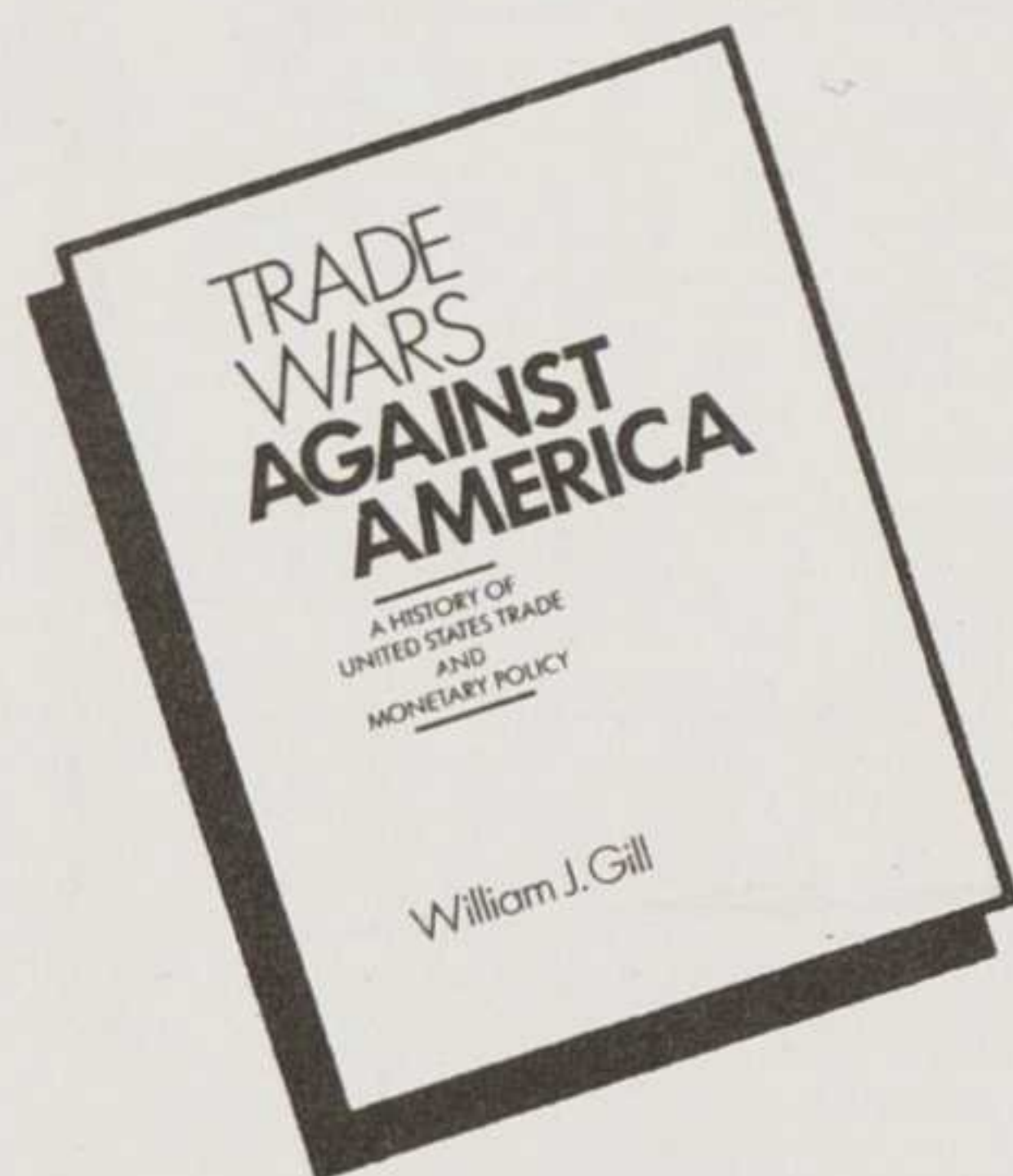

William J. Gill, author and historian, has also served as a consultant on international trade to major American industries. He has participated in more than a score of cases involving illegal imports into the United States, including subsidies by foreign governments, that were found to be in violation of both U.S. trade law and the international GATT code. Currently, he is President of the American Coalition for Competitive Trade in Washington, D.C.

This is Mr. Gill's fourth book on international affairs and domestic politics. An award-winning correspondent for UPI and *The Pittsburgh Press* earlier in his career, he has contributed to many publications, among them *Time*, *Life*, *Fortune*, the *National Geographic*, and *Nation's Business*. He was also associated with the Chase Manhattan Bank in New York and was chief executive officer of the Allegheny Foundation, T. Mellon & Sons, Pittsburgh, for six years. He is a graduate of the University of Missouri and is a member of the National Historical Society.

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
