The Family Research Council was founded in 1983 as a social policy research, lobbying and educational organization in Washington, D.C. It was governed by an independent board of directors until December 1988, when the FRC merged with Focus on the Family, a nonprofit organization committed to the preservation and strengthening of the family. The organizations joined together in the fight for traditional values in our society and in our government.

As a result of the groundwork laid during the partnership, an expanded FRC was able to spin off in 1992 and begin a new era of independent public policy exploration under the direction of President Gary Bauer. FRC is a non-partisan, nonprofit organization and is recognized under Section 501 (a) of the Internal Revenue Code as a tax-exempt 501 (c) 3. FRC's commitment is to work as an advocate for the family to the legislative, executive and judicial branches of the federal government.
