

This school of "man" is but an enemy of the true cross of Christ.

The case of this young student has an exact parallel in Savanarola, Madame Guyan and many other spiritually minded saints in the days when the popes ruled the church and most of the world. And from reformation days right down to our times this has been the pattern.

Bunyan, with his deep insight into the Word of God, along with his genuine piety, made him the brunt of hatred to the orthodox protestant "clergy" of his day. The same has been consistently true with a great many other men of God, as for instance both Wesley and Whitefield were hated and denied the privilege of using any of the pulpits of the orthodox protestant churches until the mighty Spirit of God, working through these real men, "sent of God", overthrew them all and brought in a great revival to England, that had sunk to a very low ebb, because of a corrupted and spiritually bankrupt protestantism.

Two hundred years later, when England's "fundamental" churches had again reached a very low point, God again brought forth a young man, in his teens, having had no connection with any seminary or Bible schools-C. H. Spurgeon was his name. He also was fiercely hated by all of the protestant clergy. Once again, God used this young man, true to God's Word, to upset and overthrow these dead churches.

Spurgeon also exposed the fallacy of the pagan "Christmas" and did not endorse Christian participation in carnal warfare.

Under Spurgeon's ministry the whole of England was again recovered spiritually, with the natural result that morals and politics were lifted high, and a great missionary era was ushered in which has about run its course, due largely to the bankrupt fundamentalism of today.

One point we wish to emphasize is the fact that all these great revivals of past days resulted not only in a great Spiritual uplift, but these nations were also greatly blessed in morals and politics, while today with our present leadership we are sinking into something far worse than Sodom and Gomorrah (they were heathen, while we profess a Christian civilization) while fundamentalism, overcome by the world and its idols, and its womanhood being utterly debauched by the adulterous dress of harlots, while fundamental leaders, like Nero "fiddle while Rome burns".

Don't overly much blame the poor Negro with his "burn baby burn" while fundamentalism is first to blame, and like Ephraim with his strength gone "and he knoweth it not", or like the strong man Samson with his (spiritual) eyes put out.

Not that all Christians are involved or to blame for what their top leaders will surely be held accountable for. (James 3:1).

God is not holding back these fearful forces of anti-Christ today because of such leaders as Drs. McIntire, Rice, Jones, Hargis, etc., but because of the few low and humble believers scattered over the nation. Men and women who hear and

heed His word of truth that He has magnified even above His name. (Psa. 138:2). These are they who "sigh and cry" because of all the abominations being committed. Their names will not appear on the Holy Land tour list.

These leaders today are well represented by the "old prophet of Bethel" who succeeded in turning aside the young "prophet" of God who had a message for the nation. We can well understand why God took home the young B.J.U. student--as a testimony against these corruptions of a true and living faith, of whom the "world" (B.J.U. included) was not worthy.

"They that feared the Lord spake often one to another, and the Lord hearkened and heard it, and a book of remembrance was written before Him, for them that feared the Lord and thought on His Name". (Mat. 3:16) This includes the young student, and other such at B.J.U. or elsewhere, but it excludes the high and haughty wise men of B.J.U. and many others like them.

"They that hunger and thirst after righteousness shall be filled", but none others. The meek will He guide in His way: but the proud and arrogant will stumble in their own way; for God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace to the humble".

If any man loves the Lord Jesus--He does not want the empty profession of those hearts that are divided between Himself and their World of arts---cultural attainments---sports---music and a host of other idols of this lost World; which Paul despised and threw overboard as "weights" in the "race set before him", for a nearer place in Christ.
