were scattered fairly evenly over the country. He announced plans to promote the Party by a mailing to 5,000 peace organizations throughout the country, and called attention to the heartwarming letter of support that he'd received from the Societas Populorum Progressio, Offenbach (Main), West Germany (published, with a translation, on page -6- of this Report).

The convention decided:

- To retain all of the planks of the draft platform, expand several planks, and add several. The revised platform may be found on pages -7- and -8- of this Report.

- To drop all dues requirements for membership in the Party. To become a member, a person need only accept the Party's platform, and send a written request to be enrolled as a member to the Party's national office.

- To proceed on a decentralized basis. Any member can found a branch, and any branch can receive contributions and nominate candidates.

- To endorse Bradford Lyttle as the Presidential candidate, and to authorize him to select a Vice-Presidential candidate on the basis of merit.

A spirit of good fellowship attended the convention, and the supper and singing that followed the Saturday session.

WORKSHOP ON CONSCIENTIOUS OBJECTION

A workshop on conscientious objection to war will be held in Chicago, October 12 and 13. Workshop leaders include David Dellinger, draft resister and longtime peace activist, David Finke, Chicago area peace activist and draft counsellor, and Roberto Caldero, a West Town (Chicago) community organizer. Workshop sessions will take place the evening of October 12 at Chicago Circle Center, the University of Illinois, and the morning and afternoon of October 13 at Agape House, near the University.
