

Dear Radio Friend:

We have all been stunned. We believe the mind of our country right now is fluid. The Communists are moving forward as never before. The Communist Worker, April 9, spoke of "the totality of Dr. King's dream," and said, "This newspaper subscribes to this dream. It is our dream, too."

I am reproducing Mao Tse-tung's statement.

Governor Rockefeller is calling for a rebuilding of the American cities at the cost of one hundred fifty billion dollars and Mr. Abernathy, King's successor, is calling for a guaranteed annual income for every citizen. When we accept the philosophy that the Government owes us a living, that the Government builds the cities, that the Government guarantees the wages, we shall not be very far from Communism in the United States.

The Rev. Jesse Jackson, a Chicago leader of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, who is helping to organize the "march and sit-in on the White House steps," said, "The marchers, thousands of them, are going to say to the U.S. Government either give us the help we want or we'll ruin your economy."

We were shocked by the statement of Solicitor General of the United States, Erwin N. Griswold, in New Orleans, upholding what he called "the moral right of dissenters



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
