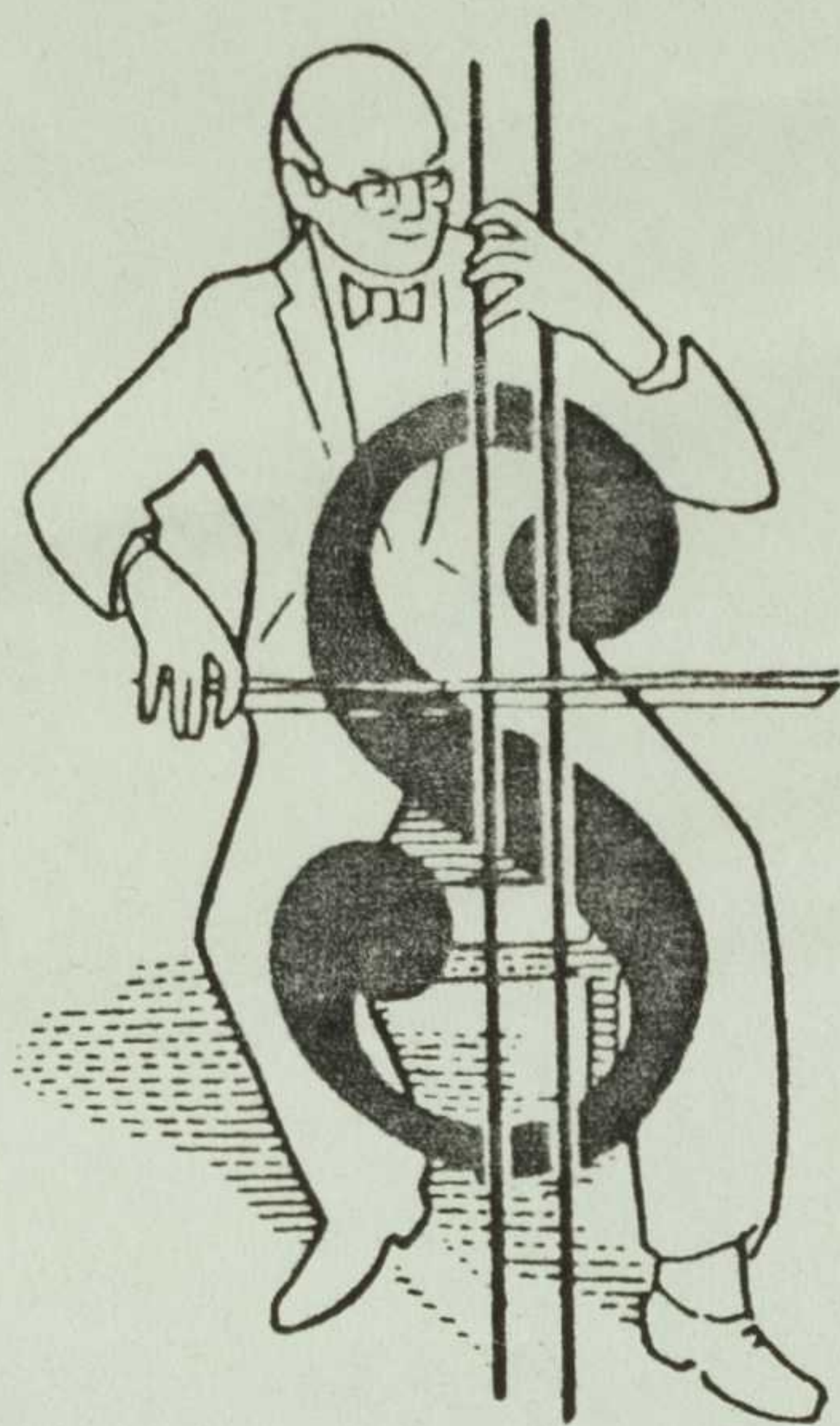

GRANT AND SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS AVAILABLE FROM SCI

SISTER CITIES INTERNATIONAL [SCI] administers several projects that include grant or scholarship components for which MEMBER CITIES may apply. These are:

YOUTH EXCHANGE CHALLENGE GRANTS. For U.S.-Mexico sister cities programs only. Effective August 1, 1989 through July 31, 1993. Maximum grant is \$5,000 per reciprocal exchange based on a theme or a community work service project.

PRACTICAL TRAINEE OR CAREER DEVELOPMENT GRANTS & SCHOLARSHIPS. For any U.S. sister cities program to conduct practical trainee or "on-the-job" career development exchanges for young people between the ages of 18 and 35. Grant range has been \$1,000 to \$15,000 depending on numbers of exchangees, length of project, etc. Proposals due to SCI the 15th of February, May, August and November annually.

FOREIGN STUDENT STUDY SCHOLARSHIPS. For inbound international students from your sister city anywhere in the world to assist in costs associated with post-secondary education and training programs. Maximum grants are \$2,000 per student, per semester. Minimum grants are \$1,000. Applications due to SCI the 1st of June (for fall semesters); the 1st of October (for spring semester); and the 1st of March (for summer semester).

YOUNG ARTISTS SCHOLARSHIPS. U.S. cities and their sister cities anywhere in the world may submit artwork into the international competition held each May in Tyler, Texas. Twelve (12) winners are chosen; each is awarded a \$500 scholarship.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE GRANTS. For U.S. cities with sister cities in developing countries. For inbound and outbound technicians to work on projects for development.
