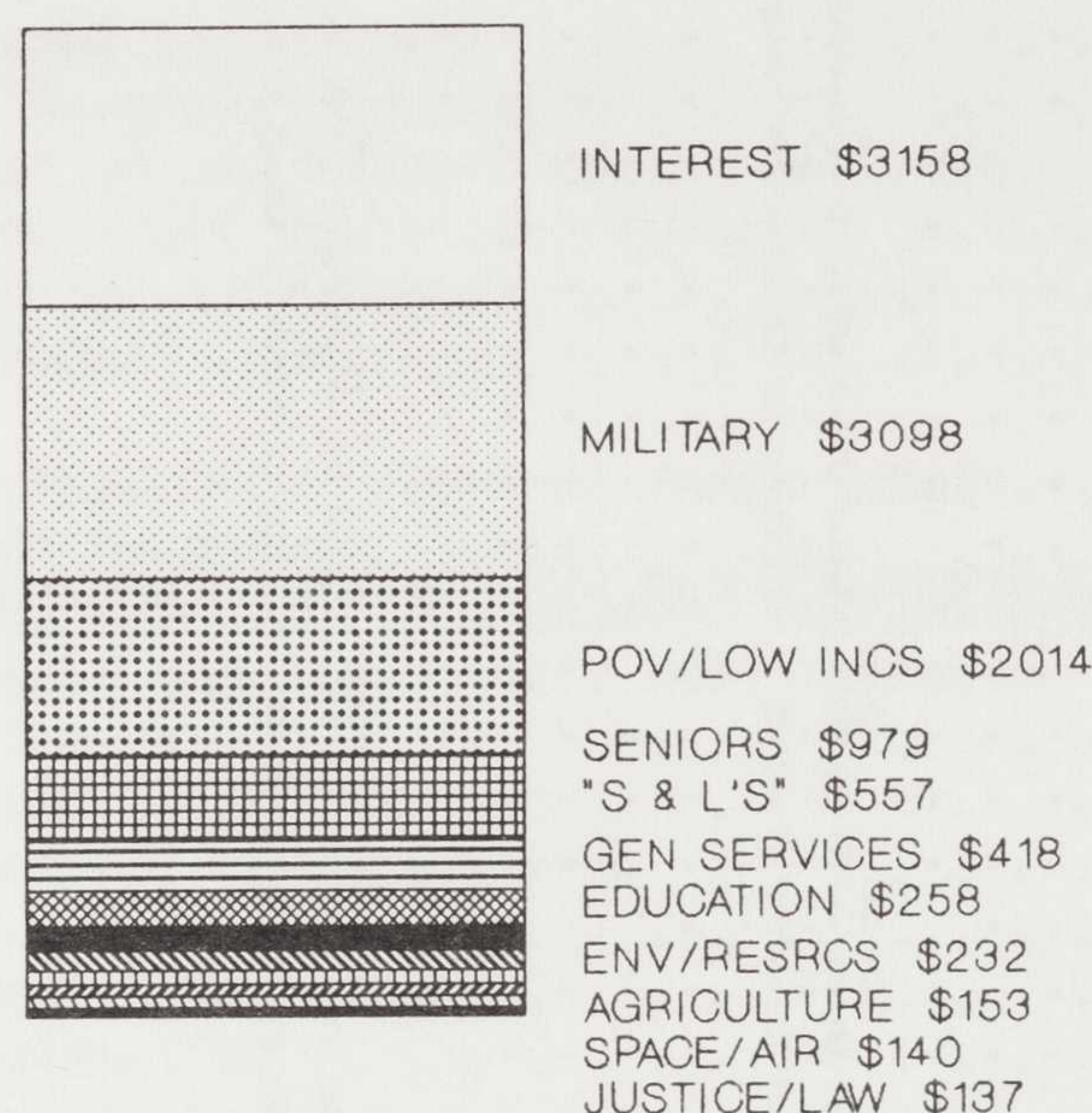


PUT IT ON THE KIDS' TAB!

There are about 97 million households in the U.S., including 28 million single person households. Let's call it 100 million, so that every time Uncle Sam spends a billion (1000 million) dollars, it costs each household 10 dollars. We can quickly determine the 1993 average share per household of any item inside by multiplying by 10, graphed below. (Not shown are general administration, \$257 and international, \$98):



But we are only paying \$699 billion toward the \$1145 billion cost (see totals inside) - *think of it as earning \$700 per week and spending \$1150 per week!* The balance is put on the "kids' tab". It breaks out as shown in the table above right:

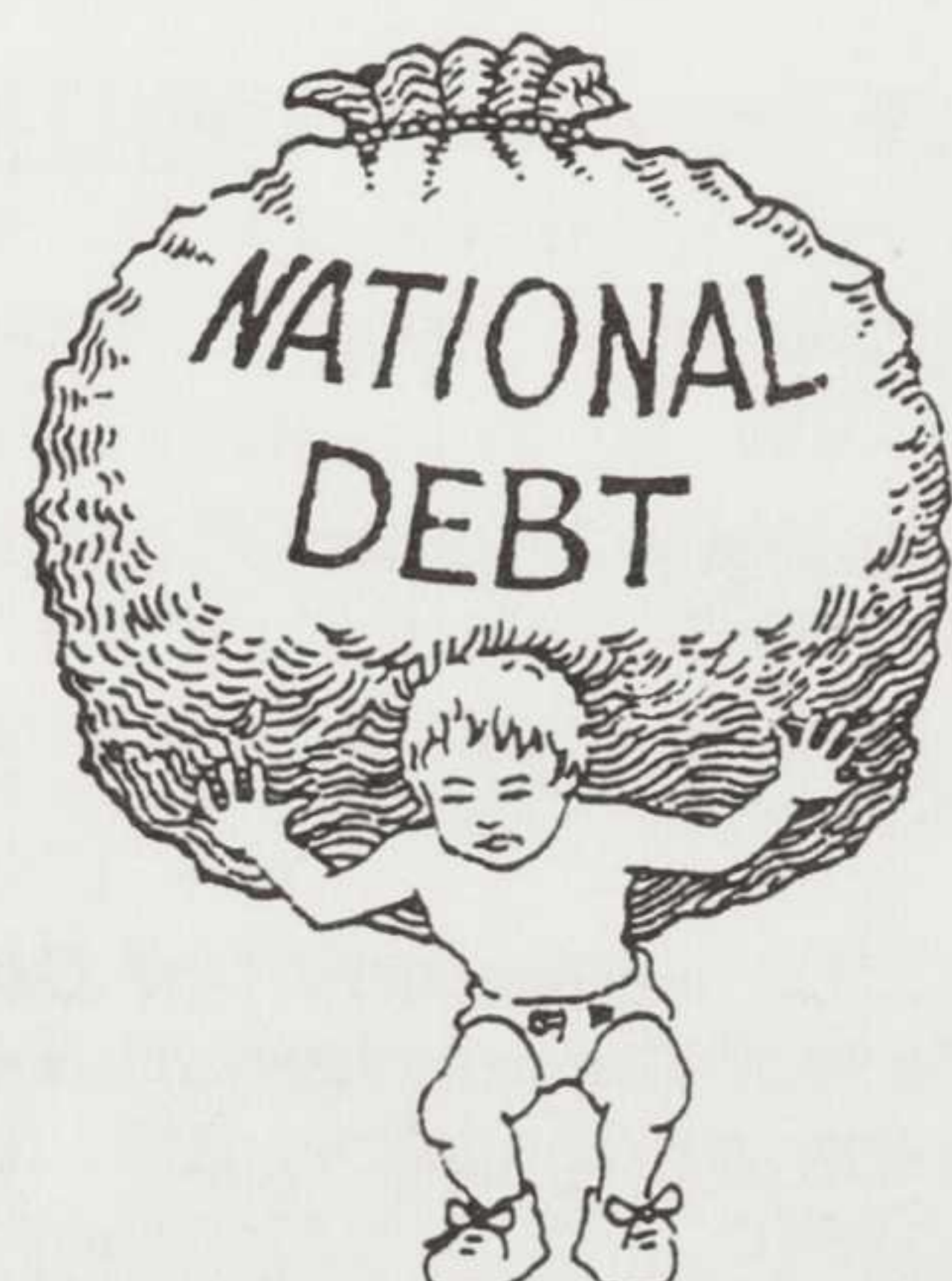
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
