Infiltration of Students For A Democratic Society

Kim Allen stands out as the best example of Y.S.A. using one of its members to affect the nature and policy of S.D.S. Kim Allen, 608 Franklin Street, Cambridge, Massachusetts, UN-8-6617, is currently chairman of the Harvard-Radcliffe S.D.S. Committee on Viet Nam. (Sometime it is confusing as to the exact nature of this Committee as to its name; but there is only one Committee at Harvard on Viet Nam and it is the S.D.S. Committee which Allen is chairman of which meets usually each Monday at Quincy Junior Common Room at 7:30 PM. Announcements appear in the Harvard Crimson for this meeting.)

At this moment Y.S.A. is working to expand the anti-war movement as much as possible and the calling of the Convention in Washington (two calls enclosed) is the major effort. Kim has used his position in the S.D.S. Viet Nam Committee to turn full attention to this matter even though many of the S.D.S. members do not approve. In fact so much opposition has arisen because of his aims that Al Walton was asked to replace Kim in a sort of "coup." Walton refused saying that he did not have the time.

A young French boy whose first name is John, and who was seen at the Y.S.A. party 12 November 1965 at 241 River Street, Cambridge, Massachusetts, is head of the S.D.S. literature tables which are set up by the S.D.S. Viet Nam Committee. Upon these tables Kim has had this individual place the magazine of the Y.S.A. Also upon these tables were placed "calls" to the convention, but not the March (Nov 27).

Tony Camejo is another member of the S.D.S. Viet Nam Committee who is a member of Y.S.A.: it appears that Camejo's job is to back up Kim Allen in the event of argument over what Y.S.A. is trying to do with the Convention in that it wants a large membership group formed which, in my opinion, would serve as a vast pool for possible recruits for Y.S.A.

Infiltration or control of the Cambridge Committee to End the War in Viet Nam

Literature is enclosed from the Cambridge Committee and it will be mentioned later in this report. It should be stated that Judy White is quite instrumental in the operation of this Committee.
