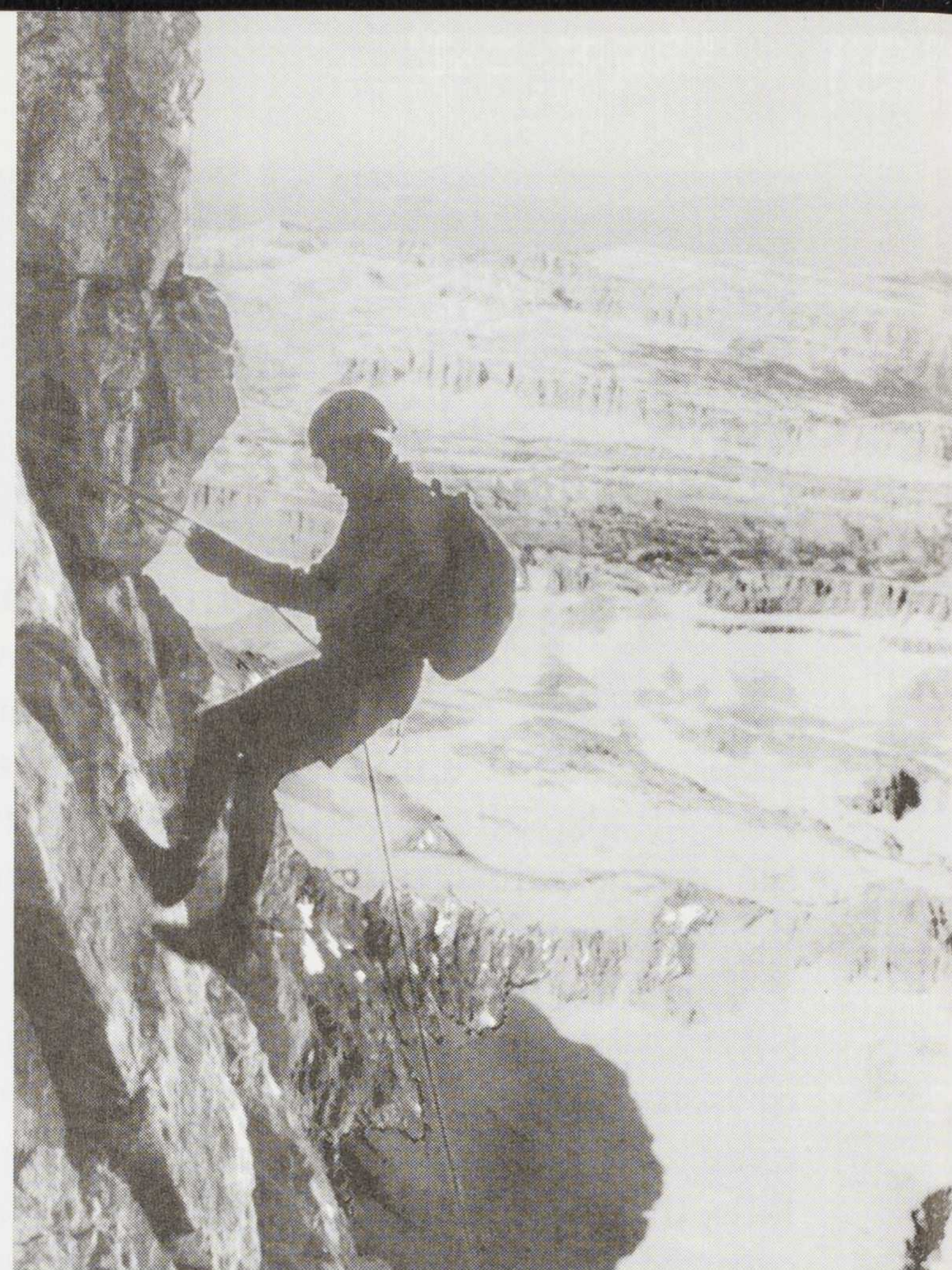
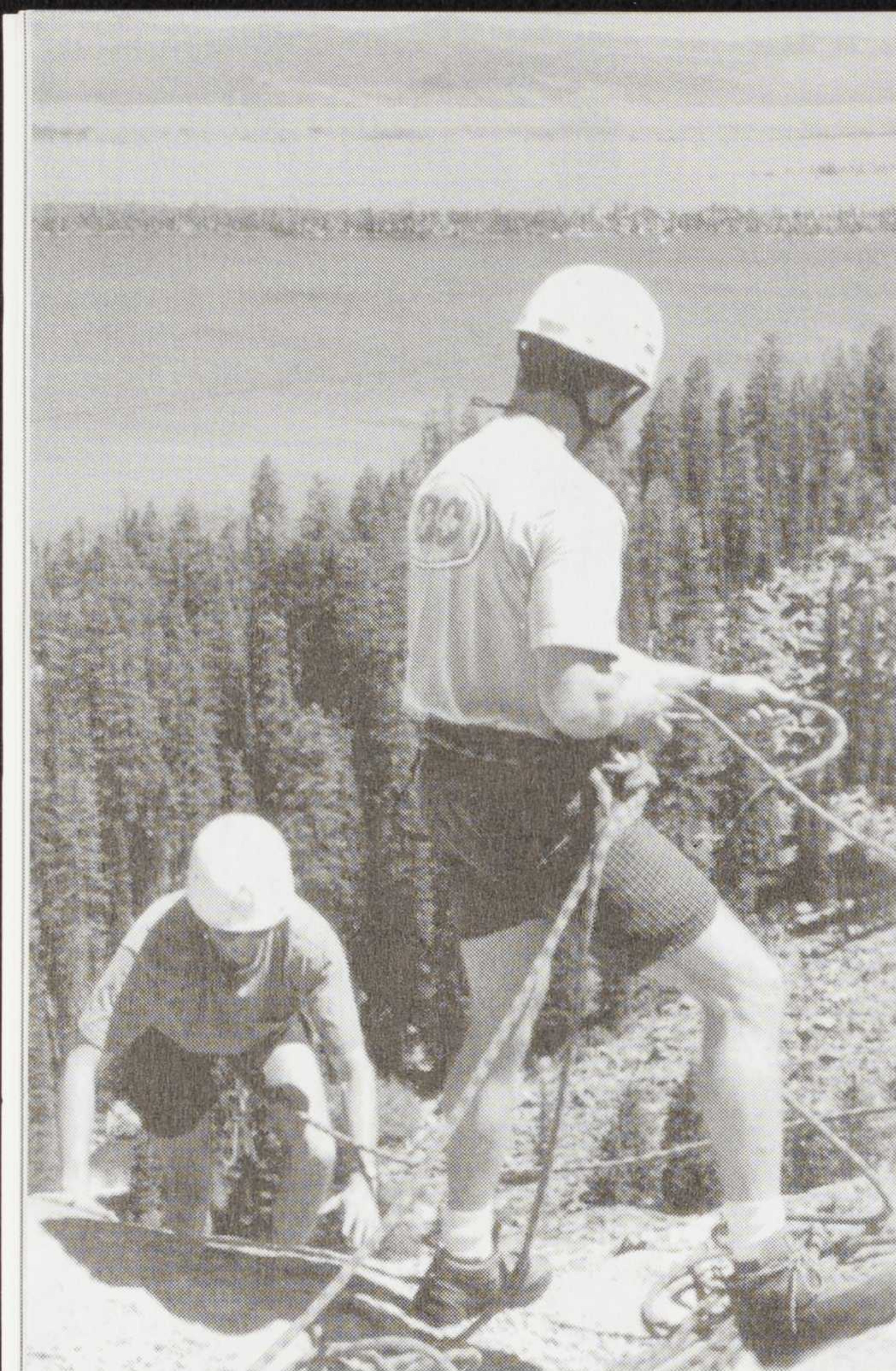




The Grand

Climb in Wyoming

Climb at one of North America's grandest peaks—no experience required.

7 Days, \$1195.
(No single accommodations)
Jackson, Wyoming

Price includes:

- Camping-style accommodations in tent or cabin;
- All breakfasts and lunches; all dinners but one (when we head into town);
- Use of equipment;
- Warm-up hike on arrival day;
- 3 days of climbing instruction, practice, and hiking;
- 2-day ascent of the Grand Teton (or other climb)

Does not include:

- Airfare;
- 1 dinner.
- (You will also need to supply a sleeping bag, suitable clothing, and climbing shoes or boots.)

The Grand Teton is known as the American Matterhorn, rising over a mile from the valley below. We will have three days of climbing instruction and hiking, with lots of exciting hands-on practice. Then, for those who choose the Grand Teton ascent, we'll begin two exhilarating and exciting days of mountaineering, camping en route at 11,000 feet. No climbing experience is needed, but you should be in good health and strong aerobic condition to join us for this trip. (Those who don't want to climb the Grand, or whose instructors feel they should not attempt this challenging ascent, will have other climbing or hiking options.)

- ★ Enjoy the rich animal life of the Tetons: Moose are a common sight; elk, grizzlies, and bald eagles may also be spotted.
- ★ Learn knots, rope work, safe climbing technique, and rappelling from expert instructors.
- ★ Hike through rugged forest, then a valley strewn with boulders the size of log cabins, on our way to base camp.
- ★ Look straight down and see 2000 feet of air as you step out on a critical move.
- ★ Stand at the 13,770-foot summit of one of North America's most famous peaks.

Is this the right trip for you? This is a great trip, but it's not for everyone. Although no climbing experience is needed, you should be in good aerobic and physical condition. We will be led by experienced local guides; nonetheless, mountaineering of any sort involves inherent and unpredictable risks. Accommodations will be in simple cabins and tents, with several people to a unit.
