During the six and a half years of its operation, the Foundation has published 130 articles and books on the philosophy and understanding of human liberty—the relationships of man to his fellow-man, the purpose of government, the forms of government, economic explanations, social arrangements, and other related subjects.

These publications range from single-sheet releases to books of several hundred pages. While most of these publications are originals, a few are reprints or translations. The Foundation also reviews, recommends, and offers for sale several books by other publishers.
