

## What is Happening to Latter-Day Christianity?

JUDE writes to the true child of God in the midst of apostacy. Jude's Epistle is full of warnings backed up by historical references to outstanding examples of apostacy.

But---His book carries comfort and assurance to the true believer, opening with a reference to the preserving grace of God. Verse 1. He closes with a marvelous doxology emphasizing the ability of our God to keep His own from falling.

After describing the apostate as being unsound, doctrinally and morally, and being without the Spirit, Verse 19, Jude introduces a description of the believer with these words---"But ye, beloved."

Then follows a Holy Spirit inspired description of the child of God in the midst of apostacy....
