

for Peace. Women's groups include Women's Action for Nuclear Disarmament (WAND) and Women's International League for Peace and Freedom (WILPF). Mobilization for Survival in Cambridge (who sponsored the largest-ever peace demonstration in New York in June, 1982) is an umbrella organization for scores of secular and religious peace groups nationwide. And the American Friends Service Committee's Cambridge office can provide in-depth information on New England peace groups and peace research. And that is not to mention the network of nonviolent witness groups such as Ailanthus.

We can think of no better way to memorialize Hiroshima and Nagasaki than for each of us to commit our personal store of atoms to the struggle for peace. The chain reaction could cause a peace explosion. Believe it or not, peace does begin with you and me. Who else?
