

## OPPOSITION TO FLUORIDATION IS WORLDWIDE

### UNITED STATES

The Delaney Committee (a Congressional committee to investigate the use of chemicals in foods and cosmetics) made a four month study pro and con on fluoridation in 1952 and rejected it. Their report has not been changed to date.

### CANADA

The Supreme Court of Canada has ruled that fluoridation of the water supply, as proposed in Toronto, Ontario, is illegal.

### FRANCE

The French Dental Society rejected fluoridation. It was also rejected by the Pasteur Institute of France on February 8, 1955

### GERMANY

"Deutsche Zahn-Zeitung": Studies show no correlation between caries frequency and the amount of fluorides used.

### SWEDEN

The Royal Medical Board prohibits any and all artificial water fluoridation in Sweden ... It is not even considered desirable or safe to endorse pure experimental fluoridation.

### SWITZERLAND

Fluoridation of drinking water has not been accomplished in Switzerland. Our population had many goitres twenty years ago -- they have disappeared because of iodized salt. Research here demonstrates an antagonism between iodine and fluorine.

### UNION OF SOUTH AFRICA

It is strongly recommended that iodized salt be not supplied to fluorine induced endemic goitre areas ... The only solution to this type of goitre is the removal of fluorine from the water supplies.

### INTERNATIONAL

The International Union Against Cancer, at their Rome (Italy) Symposium held in August, 1956, with scientists from 21 nations present, unanimously condemned a list of chemicals either deliberately being added to food and drink, or accidentally left from sprays, etc., as carcinogenic (cancer provoking), if not carcinogens (cancer starters).

Dr. W. C. Hueper, Environmental Cancer Chief of the National Institute of Health and U.S. Delegate, specifically named fluorides as one of the harmful contaminants.
