

FOR A PLACE TO LIVE

A major project of the Community for Creative Nonviolence (CCNV), in Washington, D.C. is to find housing for the homeless in the Washington area. This year the federal government made available approximately 1,000 beds in the Federal City College building at 425 Second St. However, the housing was provided only for the winter months, from December until the CCNV's lease on the College expires March 31. April 1, the government plans to close the College, and the people without homes will have to look for other accommodations (An April Fool's joke?).

Believing that the College should remain open, the CCNV has organized a protest demonstration against its closing. People throughout the country have been invited to participate in a Sunday, April 1 march from the College to a rally in Lafayette Park, across from the White House. The demonstration may have exceptionally large impact, for the television program "60 Minutes" may include footage of it in a report on the CCNV that it's preparing.

The demonstration, and the "60 Minutes" coverage of it, probably will be "old news" by the time you read this Report. However, the CCNV has an ongoing program, which it sustains entirely through private contributions.
