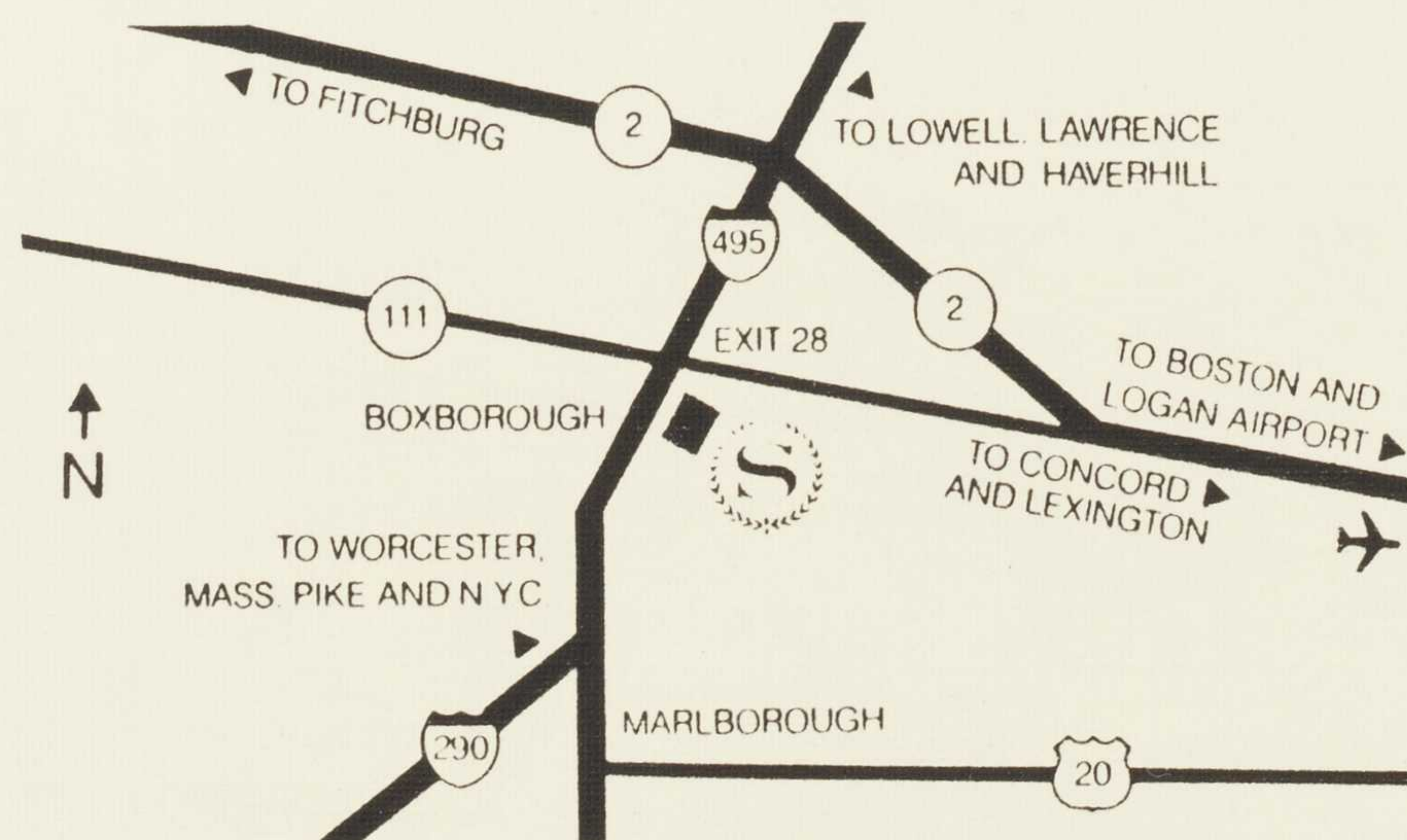

Allied Organizations for Freedom

WHO ARE WE?

We are a half-dozen organizations (as of the time of this writing), mostly of modest size and resources, that share at least one belief:

that America alone has the capacity to lead the free nations of the world in their contest with totalitarianism; that only by educating a larger public about world realities - which the media for a variety of reasons tend to ignore or gloss over - will a self-confident and assertive U.S. foreign policy emerge as a solid and bipartisan fact of life; and that it matters.

There are subjects on which we do not agree. Religion and social mores are an obvious opportunity for disagreement. We feel this has tended to prevent "conservatives" (real and alleged) from joining in cooperative projects hitherto, a situation from which the Left has profited nicely by default.

We solve this dilemma by strictly limiting the scope of our common purpose. Our by-laws (adopted March 22, 1986) state that Allied Organizations for Freedom "has the sole purpose of facilitating cooperative effort among the groups that compose its membership, with the limitation that such cooperative efforts will be in the area of common concern about the promotion and extension of freedom in the face of any type of totalitarianism," that memberships shall be open only to "groups whose ideals include the defense and extension of freedom everywhere, who recognize Soviet expansionism as a major threat to the realization of this ideal," and who "espouse neither domestic violence nor bigotry in any form."

We have made provision for individual memberships as well as organizations, inasmuch as the cause of freedom can use creativity and dedication from all sources.

We are focusing our field of membership in the New England states for practical reasons of communication and travel, but we welcome any member from any part of the country.

Finally, it is important to emphasize that this is not an "umbrella" organization superimposing itself on other independent groups. This is designed to be a mechanism of cooperation among autonomous groups to the end that member groups reinforce one another's efforts in the area of their common agreement.
