The New York City Labor Chorus has been in existence for over two years and held its first Annual Benefit Concert on June 19, 1993. Sixty members strong from over a dozen different New York City unions have been bringing music of working people to demonstrations, picket lines, union halls and college campuses. The history of labor unions and the inspirational stories of labor struggles have reached audiences around the city. The NYC Labor Chorus headed the NYC Labor Day parade in 1992, performed at the Democratic National Convention in Madison Square Garden, and brought its message of solidarity to audiences at Town Hall,

Lincoln Center and Hunter College. This commemorative poster, designed especially for the benefit concert, features a painting, "New York City," by noted Labor artist Ralph Fasanella. The poster is expected to become a collector's item, since only a limited number have been printed and can be purchased from the NYC Labor Chorus, signed or unsigned, framed or unframed, singly or in bulk.
