News Blackout Of NYC Protest

EXCLUSIVE TO THE SPOTLIGHT

A well coordinated group of 1,100 demonstrators—protesting Israeli aggression—paralyzed New York rush hour traffic and operations at the United Nations on February 19.

And, a review of the major Establishment media, including network television broadcasts and newspapers, revealed the event was totally blacked out. Not a word was mentioned in any of the media.

Despite the damp, windy and cold weather, the protest—billed as the "Day of Outrage Continues"—frustrated city officials.

Organized by a coalition of several community-based groups, the demonstrators—ignored by the Establishment media—protested "the murder of Palestinians on the West Bank and in Gaza, the Israeli extermination campaign aimed at the Black Hebrews and the continued funding of Israel by the U.S. government and private interests," said Sunny Carson, New York head of the December 12th Coalition, a participating group.

"The people have matured. We have now drawn the necessary intercon-

nections with those crimes committed against us here in the United States as well as those insidious acts of repression committed against us internationally," he continued.

CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE

"Day of Outrage" is the title for what has become a series of public civil disobedience campaigns in recent months, initially organized to protest police treatment of Blacks in New York.

In previous "Outrage" demonstrations, dating back to June 1987, the protesters had disrupted city transportation services—halting buses and trains—to force recognition of their grievances.

With the February 19 protest, the platform focused more on Israel and international oppression by the world Zionist community. This prompted the participation of organizations from New Jersey, Philadelphia, Chicago and Washington.

While city officials hoped the inclement weather would cause a cancellation, the protest organizers said, the 2,000 policemen assigned to manage the demonstration were not enough.

At about 2 pm, approximately 600 demonstrators descended upon the UN to present their demands to Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar. The

play proved to be "diversionary," drawing police attention away from the downtown area.

Expecting trouble, police units of from 15 to 20 officers stood at each cor-

ner for about 10 blocks in Manhattan. Then in a surprise move, six 25-foot-long furniture trucks driven by protesters swerved at angles blocking major thoroughfares at 42nd Street and Lexington Avenue in the city's diamond district.

Having leaked the air from the trucks' tires, the drivers abandoned the vehicles and disappeared into the crowd. The disabled vehicles caused a massive traffic jam.

LITERATURE DISTRIBUTED

As the confusion peaked, protesters entered area businesses distributing fliers to shopkeepers. Others gave litera-

ture to stranded motorists caught in the gridlock.

"I'm tired of hearing about the holocaust," said Sonya Gillespie, a student from Buffalo City College, who had driven to New York to participate in the rally. "Right over there in Israel today, they are tormenting Black babies and women for no reason."

Helen Dennis, a Harlem resident, added, "I've been living in Harlem struggling to raise my children and just survive. Yet I am clear about the racist practices of these people and the merchants who have robbed our community and set themselves up for life."
