

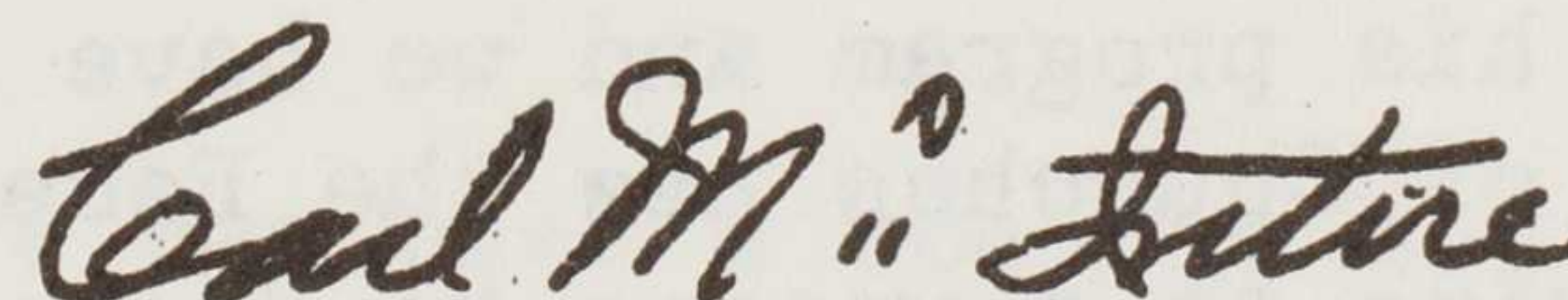
My dear friend, the FCC is vulnerable. It is operating, I am convinced, in violation of the Constitution of the United States and all of this has been built up by the political powers which are running the affairs in Washington. What do they care about the little preacher? When questions of freedom of religion are raised, it ought to be of great concern to the Federal Communications Commission to maintain the constitutional right. If they are going to protect anything, they ought to protect liberty. Instead, they are the ones transgressing it! It is all part of an overall struggle to determine who and what shall reach the mind of the American public. Never did we have such an opportunity to persuade the American people that the course we have been taking in relationship to the whole civil rights movement is fundamentally wrong. These leaders who are calling for the burning of our cities and the killing of our President, are calling for surrender in Vietnam. There is an association between the two. We are fighting in His Name and for His glory. This is our country. Let's not let the Communists take it away from us or destroy us by confusion. The stage is set today for the same powers that have provoked these riots in a limited number of our cities to call for riots in virtually every city where there is a Negro concentration, and this could be done in an hour of crisis when the Communists feel they are strong enough to press their demands upon us.

I appeal to you. This is the height of our summer. Our receipts are the lowest. People are away on vacation. Will you, as soon as you lay this letter down, pick up your checkbook, and use it? And, will you say "Amen" to this letter, and let that Amen be your determination at this moment to stand with Carl McIntire and Amen Charlie. I promise you that I will not yield, I will not compromise. In no sense will we surrender.

Let us fight the battle together. Thank you. I shall await your letter.

Newscasts Freed Of 'Fairness' Rule

The Federal Communications Commission says it is exempting news broadcasts and on-the-spot coverage of news events from the provisions of its fairness doctrine governing personal attacks.

Under the fairness doctrine a station broadcasting a personal attack must notify the individual being attacked and provide him with a transcript of the material.

Under the new rule this will no longer be required for newscasts and coverage of breaking news stories. News interview programs and documentaries must continue to meet all the fairness doctrine requirements, the FCC said.
