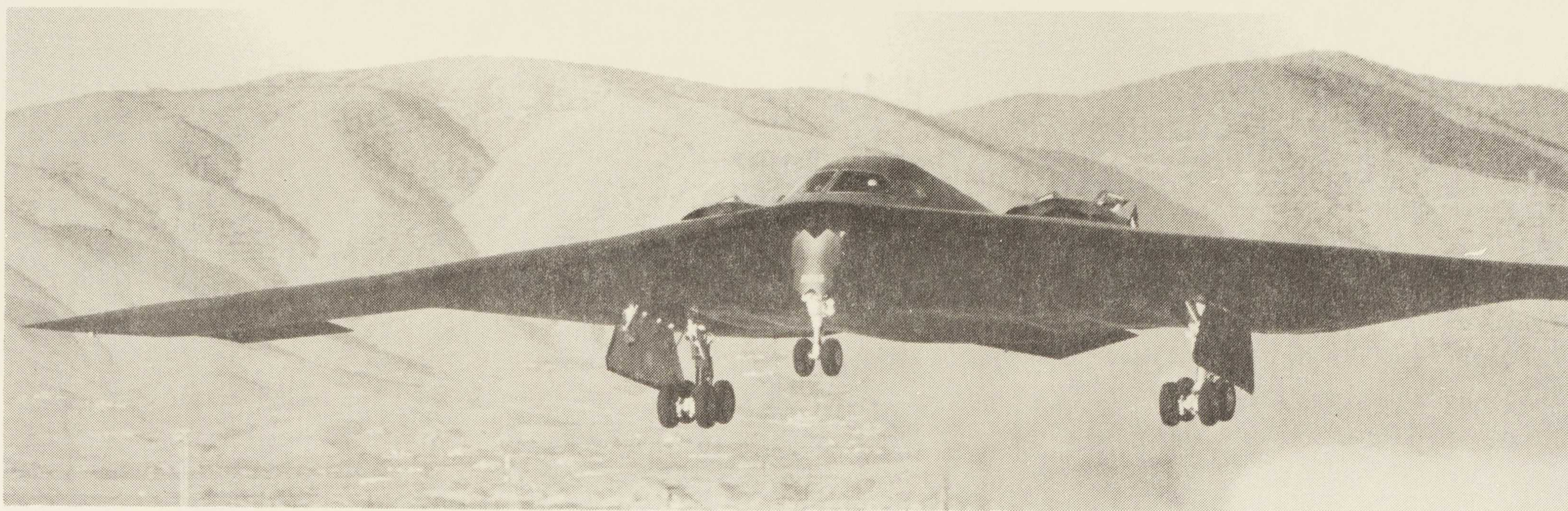




The B-2 Stealth Bomber Cost: \$600 million each

Can We Kick the Cold War Habit?

Despite the budget crisis and the dramatic changes taking place in the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe, Congress spends billions of our tax dollars for new weapons systems such as Star Wars, B-2 Stealth bombers, and mobile MX and Midgetman missiles.

The \$305 billion fiscal-year 1990 military-spending bill approved by Congress allocates \$3.8 billion more for the Star Wars antimissile program, which has already consumed \$18 billion. Congress, having

spent \$22 billion on the B-2, provides an additional \$4.3 billion in the budget for the bomber, which will cost at least \$600 million each or \$79 billion for the 132 bombers the Air Force wants. The military-spending bill provides \$1.1 billion for MX and \$100 million for Midgetman, a down payment for the \$10 billion MX and \$30 billion Midgetman programs. Defense Secretary Richard Cheney's plans to cut future military spending apparently do not include funding cuts for these weapons.
