GIOVANNI COSTIGAN's background is well known except that a recent letter from American Veterans Committee says he is their local representative. This outfit has a history of affiliations with communist movements.

ALEX GOTTFRIED was a speaker in the Seattle Peace March, was advertised as the speaker for the United World Federalists, and was announced as the chairman of a Morton Sobell meeting.

ABRAHAM KELLER was signer of a statement for Committee for Peaceful Alternatives to the Atlantic Pact; admitted Communist Party membership and was a sponsor of Mid-Century Conference for Peace.

DR. LINDEN MANDER was affiliated with Independent Citizens Committee of Arts, Science and Professions; Institute of Pacific Relations; a Seattle Labor College speaker; he protested dismissal of Profs. Gundlach, Phillips & Butterworth, all communists. He was on Washington State Committee Opposing Peacetime conscription and is the only man member of Women's International League for Peace and Freedom from Washington state.

ROBERT PICKUS, Univ. of Calif., is active in peace movements such as Committee for Non-Violent Action, speaker at Seattle Peace March and was on Citizens Emergency Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs.

The recent exposure of Ballantine Books has had its effect and sales of "Un-Americans" by lefty Frank Donner have fell to the level it deserves.

Religious Freedom Committee has mailed copies of the Donner book to its entire mailing list, requesting them to remit and to influence news stands to handle the book. The letter is signed by Wm. Howard Melish defrocked Episcopalian.

The officers and Ex. Com. of the Religious Freedom Committee are almost entirely red-fronted ministers except for one professor and six women of questionable vintage.
