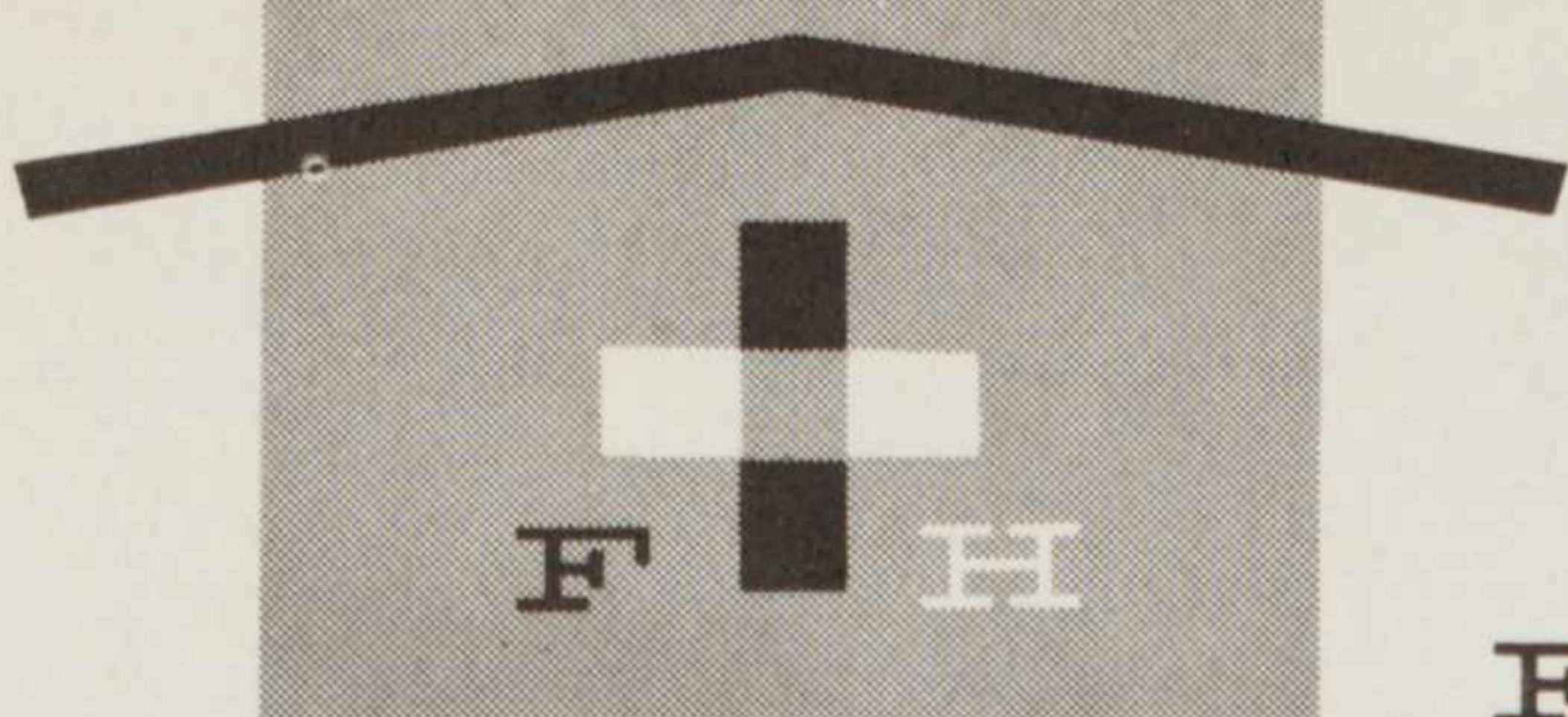

Dear Friend of Friendship House,

Bridges are built so that people may cross. Together we have been building bridges over which many, both black and white, have crossed--never to return to the separation of the past. At the moment, though, the mood for separation grows.

Against it, we must continue our efforts. We have recently opened an experimental center on Ashland Avenue on Chicago's tense Southwest Side to confront the "wall" erected through fear and ignorance. We are here to support the efforts of concerned whites as they struggle with the bigotry and panic in their own community. We are here also to support and foster communication between the black and the white communities.

Our Southern program is strengthened by the arrival of Sister Anne Michele of the Benedictine community in Fort Smith, Arkansas. Sister will be with us for at least a year and will channel "Sister Power" to key Southern areas, building up local leadership to bridge the problems caused by racial separation.

We must continue--indeed not only continue, but expand! To do this additional staff is needed ... new areas must be covered more people must be reached! Do we continue? We cannot afford not to! Can you give \$5, \$10, \$25? Or better yet, can you join those who have pledged to support us monthly? Help us to build bridges!
