Fluoridation Called Poison by Doctor

NORTH EAST—"Fluoridation is one of the biggest international scandals that has ever been promoted in the name of a health scheme."

This is the opinion of Dr. Robert J. H. Mick of Laurel Springs, N. J., who was once an active promoter of fluoridation. Today, however, he is one of its strongest opponents.

Backing up his opposition, Dr. Mick is offering \$20,000 to "anyone in the world who can obtain from the promoters of fluoridation one copy of a controlled experiment with the recommended

fluoridation and water at the recommended parts per million that show that these poisonous fluorides are not harmful and will cause no future body harms."

Dr. Mick says he has proof that a "secret meeting" took place in Washington, D. C., June 6-8, 1951, where all the plans for promotion of fluoridation were set.

Dr. Mick said that more than 50 state public health representatives and representatives of the American Dental Association attended that meeting.

FLUORIDATION FRAUD

\$20,000 Fluoride Offer Has No Takers

BOCA RATON — A Treasure Island, Fla., dentist has been trying to give away \$20,000 for 14 years and still has no takers.

After a statement in the Sun-Sentinel that the Boca Raton Chamber of Commerce had endorsed water fluoridation for the city, a quarter-page newspaper advertisement appeared offering that amount at the city council meeting this week.

Dr. Robert Mick made the offer to "anyone in Boca Raton who can obtain from any promoter of fluoridation one bona-fide, controlled experiment that shows that these 'poisonous fluorides' are beneficial, safe and will cause no future body harm."

The experiment, according to the ad, had to use the United States Public Health Service-recommended fluorides and water, at the service's recommended parts per million.

No one showed up with an

experiment, though, and the city council went right along with its business. According to Mick, this has been the case for 14 years.

"I could offer \$100,000 and it wouldn't make any difference," he said. "It's never been done and it's never going to be."

While the adjustment of fluorides in the Boca Raton water system has been endorsed by the chamber of commerce, the issue has not yet come before the city council or voters.

Mayor Harold Maull Wednesday charged that, while no experimentation took place at the meeting, the council floor "is not a place for give-away prizes — we're not competing with the gas companies."

Mick, however, claimed that promoters of fluoride "used" radio, newspapers, parent-teacher associations and Jaycees, and he apparently felt that council meetings were effective places to get his point across.

He called the widespread

promotion of water fluoridation "the biggest international fraud in the name of health" and laid the blame on the state.

Mick said he was an original promoter of fluoridation in 1944 at the New York Institute of Clinical Oral Pathology but that it wasn't until several years later after personal research that he "realized what a fraud I had become involved in."

The realization he claimed was prompted by his discovery of a "secret meeting" in Washington, D.C., where, he said, health officials were advised "how to 'use' newspapers and PTA's and 'build fires under any dentist who opposed fluoridation.'"

He claimed that "so much work" has been done proving fluoridation harmful that "you could publish something every day and not run out for a year."

"But if they (dental health officials) can 'use' the radio, newspapers, PTA's and Jaycees, they've got a 49 per cent chance of getting fluoridation through," he said.

AMERICANS UNITED TO COMBAT FLUORIDATION

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
