Dear Governor Hughes,

As a group of citizens who are dedicated to informing the public of unconstitutional actions and usurpations of power, we have, until now, confined our activities to matters within our own state and the Federal Government.

However; since the dictatorial action on the part of the Board of Education of the State of New Jersey, against Shelton College sets a dangerous precedent involving the rights of all Americans, we are compelled by conscience to protest.

In revoking the accreditation of this college, without a hearing, without even notifying their Board of Directors in advance; The Board of Education has shown their gross disregard for the rights of all citizens.

In stating that the students of this college would be re-located, they indicated they have the power to close any school, college or university that does not meet with their approval, and could assign the students to a school of their choosing.

Dr. Carl McIntire, President of Shelton College and a great Christian Anti-communist leader, has been the frequent target of collectivists because he reports documented facts on the creeping tyranny that is spreading over our land. Recent attempts by the Democratic National Committee to use the Federal Communications Commission to intimidate station owners that carry his broadcasts is just one example of the methods employed to suppress freedom of speech and keep from the public, facts they should know.

Having brought this matter to your attention, we respectfully ask that you investigate and make public the reasons behind this power-grab by a department in your administration. The courage you might display in defending the rights of the citizens you represent, will be received by millions with respect and gratitude.

We shall give copies of this letter as wide a distribution as possible as we will with all forth-coming results of this situation.
