



EISENHOWER INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

In 1987 Sister Cities International (SCI) established the **Eisenhower International Scholarship Fund** which is supported by the proceeds of the Eisenhower International Golf Classic and administered by the SCI Education Committee.

The **Eisenhower International Scholarship Fund** provides scholarships of varying amounts, but not more than \$2,000, for international students to attend U.S. post-secondary educational institutions or programs.

Any U.S. sister cities committee, that is a member of SCI, may apply for scholarships to assist international students, generally from their sister city, who have been accepted for enrollment in a U.S. post-secondary educational institution or program in or near the U.S. city.

Eisenhower International Scholarships may be used for expenses generally associated with a foreign student attending a U.S. post-secondary educational institution or program, such as, tuition and fees, room and board, books, travel within the U.S. city or environs.

Scholarship applications are reviewed three times a year according to the following schedule:

Application Deadline	Notification
June 1 (fall semester)	July 1
October 1 (spring semester)	November 1
March 1 (summer semester)	April 1

Criteria for Application

The applying U.S. sister cities committee must:

- be a member of Sister Cities International;
- coordinate arrangements between themselves and their counterpart abroad;
- coordinate arrangements with the post-secondary institution or program to which the international student has been admitted;
- provide additional support, either cash or in kind/donated; and
- be the designated sponsor of the student while s/he is in the United States.

The international student for whom the U.S. sister cities committee is applying must:

- be accepted for admission in the post-secondary education institution *prior* to his/her departure from their own country;
- be accepted by the institution or program *before* applying for the scholarship;
- have the proper visa to enter the U.S. and to attend the educational institution or program;
- meet the English language and other requirements of the college, university or program, such as, TOEFL, SAT, GRE, and GMAT tests; and
- provide certified transcripts, proof of financial sponsorship, completed application forms and fees, and letters of recommendation.

SCI recommends that a letter from the chairman of the applicant's sister city committee accompany the application.
