

salvation on the basis of the shed blood of Jesus Christ. One reads this creed with the recognition that there is nothing in it about salvation by faith.

Here indeed we have some very pious phrases but the uninstructed and the person who lacks discernment given by an understanding of the great doctrines of the Christian faith may be entirely led astray. The references, of course, to Jesus Christ as Saviour of the world are indeed the general references which, under the present attack of modernism, eliminates the blood, the expiation, the atonement, the substitution, and these great realities which are a part of the one and only way of salvation. An ignorant and uninformed church can be so easily led astray. So many are. But we must "contend earnestly for the faith once delivered to the saints" (Jude 3).
