Bureau of Investigation, did not divulge his knowledge of the existence of the plot. The authors have uncovered evidence which shows that by mid-October of 1963, Hoover knew many of the details of the forthcoming assassination attempt; information gleaned from Boston, Chicago, and Dallas, were thoroughly investigated and verified. Regulations spelled out in the F.B.I. manual state that any information pertaining to such threats against the safety of the President were to be immediately referred to the Secret Service. Apparently, Hoover's motives included a desire to mind his own business. He did not personally disapprove of the killings since he detested all that the President represented. Hoover's lack of action was recognized however, and Texas retaliated by charging that Lee Harvey Oswald had worked with the F.B.I. as an informer since 1962.

Clearly, Farewell America holds a vast store of information, probably some fiction as well as fact, but that we, the American people, as part of a democratic society, have a right to examine and probe. Banning such material from the United States is not only a violation of one of our most basic freedoms, that of the press, but also may be denying due process of the law.
