

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- * **Make** a generous contribution to the Center for Constitutional Rights which is defending Margaret Randall in the I.N.S. proceedings against her and has initiated Randall's counter-suit against the I.N.S. Whether the immigration judge's decision is favorable or not, appeals and litigation will continue. Checks made out to "CCR/Randall Case" are tax-deductible and can be sent to the Boston Committee to Defend Margaret Randall.
- * **Make** copies of the enclosed articles and distribute them to your friends and colleagues, and at local events. Put an article in your organization's newsletter informing people about the Randall case and asking them to write letters and send donations. Get your local newspaper to write an editorial in support of Margaret Randall, or write an op-ed article or a letter to the editor yourself.
- * **Urge** individuals and organizations to protest the October, 1985 decision by the INS denying Margaret Randall permanent resident status by writing to Allan C. Nelson, Commissioner, I.N.S., 425 I Street NW, Washington, DC 20536. Get your organization to pass a resolution supporting Margaret Randall and condemning the ideological exclusion provisions of the McCarran-Walter Act. Send copies of letters and resolutions to the INS and to your congressional representatives.
- * **Write** to Representative Peter Rodino, who chairs the House Judiciary Committee, and to Representative Barney Frank, who is a member of the Subcommittee on Immigration of the House Judiciary Committee, and urge them on in their efforts to revise immigration procedures. Insist that they put an end to the exclusion of non-citizens on ideological grounds. If you are from Barney Frank's district, it is especially important that he hear from you.
- * **Organize** a house party or cultural event to raise funds for Margaret Randall's legal defense. Encourage people who attend to write letters and get their organizations involved in the case.
