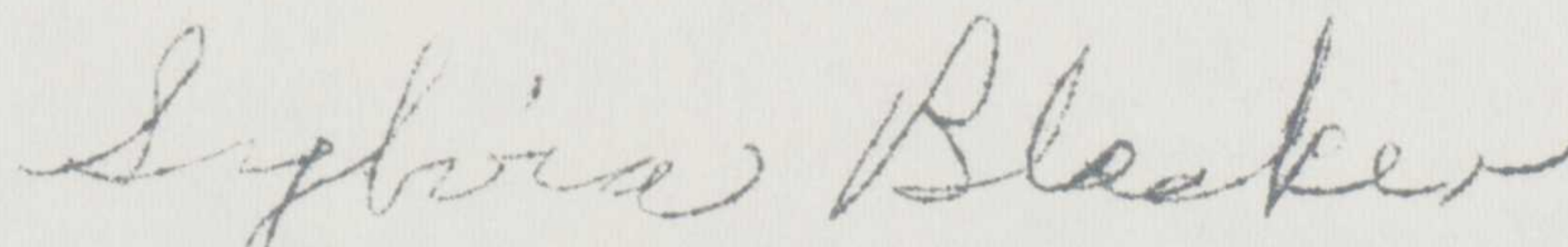
No longer! From the very beginning of 1968, we will conduct a program intended to bring the Fellowship to the forefront in our town. At the High School, in Adult Education, we will sponsor a 5-week Human Relations Seminar with heavier enrollment than last year and with much more publicity. We will be pursuing Fair Housing in ways that get prime attention. We plan bringing our slide-show story to many other Milton organizations. We intend and we have the material for an endless flow of publicity about our operations and their goals.

The program has been organized and parts of it already launched. Three things the Fellowship asks you to do to help put it across in a big and important way:

- 1- Attend our meetings; have your way in guiding the Fellowship's program.
- 2- Take part in the program activities. There is a place for you and we need you.
- 3- Send in your 1968 dues. This year, dues are \$3 per person. Many of the key elements in the program cost money. We need everyone's dues promptly, to get them started properly.
