Albizu Campos and the Ponce Massacre by Juan Antonio Corretjer

A vivid portrayal of the heroic struggle of the oppressed people of Puerto Rico for independence. The story of the massacre of 1937 is written by a comrade of Albizu Campos, the great leader of the Nationalist Party. 25 pp., 75¢

Busing and Self-Determination by Sam Marcy

An important contribution to the struggle against racism. Traces work in Boston, Mass., against groups like the Nazis and the Ku Klux Klan who used opposition to so-called "forced busing" as a way to mobilize against the right of Black children to a decent education. It gives a clear and concise statement on the Marxist position on the right of self-determination for oppressed people. 15 pp., 25¢

Capitalist Economic Stagnation and the Revolutionary Perspective by Sam Marcy

Probes the reasons behind the economic crisis in the capitalist world. Explains the significance of the U.S. defeat in Southeast Asia, the collapse of the Franklin National Bank, the growing weight of militarism in the economy, and the crisis in the cities. 46 pp., 50¢ (A set of two pamphlets)

Chile: 1970-1973: From Allende's Election to the Fascist Takeover Reprinted from *Workers World*

Covers the major developments in Chile's tumultuous period from 1970 to the brutal CIA-organized coup in 1973. The articles warned of the great danger facing the Chilean workers and peasants as U.S. imperialism mobilized the reactionary forces of the Chilean state against the organizations of the masses.

China: The Struggle Within by Sam Marcy, Deirdre Griswold, and Naomi Cohen

Covers developments in the People's Republic of China from 1959 to 1972. Includes: the Peoples' Communes; War in Tibet; China's early revolutionary positions; the Cultural Revolution; and detente with the U.S. Also includes an original analysis of the Cultural Revolution and the fall of Lin Piao. Provides essential background for the events unfolding in China today. 120 pp., \$2.00

China: The Suppression of the Left by Sam Marcy

Analyzes the sweeping developments in China following the death of Mao Tse-tung. Written in the very heat of the events and verified by later developments, these articles deal mostly with the defeat of the left wing of the Chinese Communist Party and the comeback of the rightists purged during the Cultural Revolution. Also explains the significance of the Cultural Revolution, the Shanghai Commune, and the fall of Lin Piao. Defends the position that while there has been an historic defeat and setback in the course of the Chinese Revolution, China still remains a socialist country despite its current reactionary leaders. 111 pp., \$2.00
