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A published bulletin of the University of New Mexico (1938), and the report of Dr. Heyroth in the 1952 issue of Journal of Public Health clearly carries that warning, and the menace of fluorine-in-water. And the articles by Dr. Charles Dillon and Alfred Taylor (Univ. of Texas) that can be read in the November 1953 and April 1954 issues of Dental Digest, set forth clearly the degenerative effects of "fluorosis" --- the first visible signs being the "slight-mottling" of the teeth that the public health dentists shrug off or refuse to understand.

Dr. Leo Spira, M.D. of New York, and with an international reputation of 25 years of research in the effects of fluorides on the human body, clearly compares the fluorides with the arsenic poison effects; and is urging that "fluoride-free" water supplies should be the program of those honestly concerned with the health of the nation.

The published research of the damage of fluorides to the human body is not told to city councilmen and water-works men, or to the civic-leaders and "endorsing" medical and dental memberships. The public health service dominated officials enforce a very effective "black-out" that denies this very essential medical information to responsible officials.

"Endorsements" and votes of city council, or even city-wide ballots, are not honest substitutes for published research or long range clinical research on the general effects of fluorides.

In my opinion, the dental profession, locally and nationally, does not fully comprehend that passing even the smallest part of their responsibility for preventive dentistry onto a public utility like the waterworks, is the first step on an international pattern to create the welfare state.

The Surgeon-General of the United States has already told the dental profession the part they must accept, and the propaganda master-plan, to use the water works.

It is really shocking to see professional groups in the healing arts, who challenge the privilege of non-medical experts to sell drugs, suddenly become advocates that the engineering profession take on the medical responsibility of selling fluoride-treated water that will create degenerative "fluorosis". This accepted medical fact alone, should make the water works officials reject "fluoridation" instantly. That they do not do so, is only because they are denied knowledge of the true effects of fluorides, and given dishonest advice by public health officials.

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
