We measure success in educating people about the realities and risks of AIDS and how they can prevent it...and in having provided services and support to more than 375 people who have lived with AIDS.

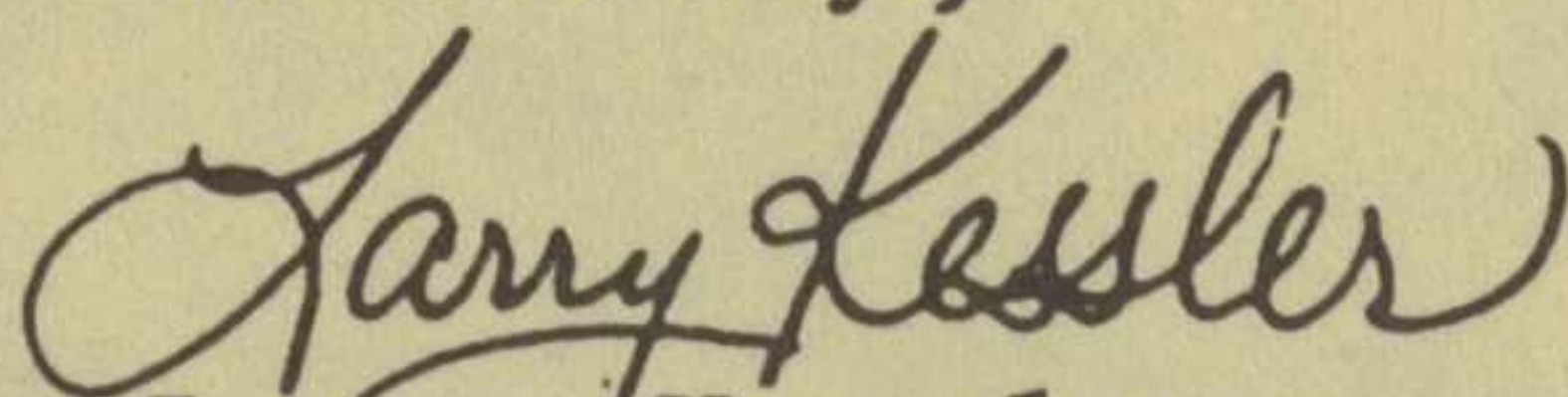
