

In the campaign to end the nuclear arms race PSR has:

- ◆ held symposia on the medical effects of nuclear war throughout the United States;
- ◆ conducted voter education programs including candidate forums and debates;
- ◆ formed national and local coalitions with professional and other like-minded groups;
- ◆ launched study groups on such issues as the comprehensive test ban;
- ◆ published original research on low level radiation, civil defense planning, and the psychological effects of the arms race;
- ◆ joined Soviet and other physicians in an international debate on nuclear war prevention as the United States affiliate of International Physicians for the Prevention of Nuclear War;
- ◆ toured the country with nationally known physicians and scientists;
- ◆ activated a legislative alert network; and
- ◆ promoted nuclear war education in two-thirds of American medical schools.
