

Red Lion, Apollo, and Bob Jones still carry the program, and surely deserve a hero's medal, as they have persevered through the storms.

The first pressures developed against WVCH. It came time for the renewal of the license of that station. Mr. Tisdale's lawyer in Washington informed him that if he would discontinue Mr. McIntire's program that he would have no difficulty in getting his license renewed by the FCC. Mr. Tisdale told me that pressures were upon him to put me off, but that he intended to carry me and honor our rights of free speech. But the forces which desired our voice to be silenced were so powerful that we were put off WVCH. Mr. Tisdale never told the full story. He later died. Church groups all over the land, ministerial unions, were going in to radio station owners and threatening us. The information that I was giving was getting through to the people. We were enjoying the blessings of liberty. All of that has now been changed.

The drive to reach the 1000 stations, which was our goal, began to mount across the country. One hundred, one hundred and fifty — we had a celebration at the 300 mark — 400, up to 500 — people were giving \$1000 to open a new station. Radio committees were being formed; things were happening.

Every month through the various seasons, new events and issues presented themselves, upon which

we took stands. The whole religious world literally came within the compass of our news accounts. I began to publish scrapbooks and give away books of all kinds. Literally thousands, into the millions, of pieces of literature were distributed.

Our own code on our present productions now exceeds 690. This can be seen on each document, the last three letters giving the month and the year. John Stormer's book **None Dare Call It Treason**, 1964, which reached a circulation of 9 million, ranks at the top.

Our office staff began to expand and we were employing some 75-80 persons. In the 20 years the **Christian Beacon**, which sponsors the broadcast, has grown and expanded. Here I photographically reproduced many of the documents discussed on the radio. Even to begin to list the events would be impossible.

Rallies became the order of the day, and there is hardly a section of the country to which we did not go and to which we now continue to go to promote the broadcast and some cause in which it is currently involved.

As of this anniversary, the broadcast has helped bring to pass the great Cape Canaveral miracle — the one million dollars raised by December 27 in gifts and loans from 20,000 people over the world. After that, I spent three weeks rallying our people by means of the broadcast to confront and to chase
