Proposed Brazilian Goodwill Trade Mission to the United States, Headed by Prof. Americo Campiglia, President of the São Paulo Development Bank.

REF: Previous correspondence on this project being arranged by Mr. Nilo Ramos in cooperation with PanAm World Airways.

1. Nelson de Souza telephoned me this morning. Nilo Ramos was with him. He said they were now considering a "kick-off" luncheon to be held at the National Club around September 9 for between 40 and 50 people. He wondered what leading Americans in the community should be invited.

2. I reminded Nelson I had mentioned this proposed mission several times to the Board of Directors of the American Chamber of Commerce, and that Jorge Fragoso, Chairman of the Brazilian/American Relations Committee, of which Mr. Alan Fisher is a member, was also aware of the matter. I suggested the American Officers and Directors of the Chamber should be invited to the luncheon, as well as Fragoso.

3. Mr. de Souza agreed, thanked me, and said Mr. Fisher and I were of course invited. The exact date of the luncheon will be communicated later.
