

ALLIED ORGANIZATIONS FOR FREEDOM



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1. Stationery: I have prepared the above letterhead because Earle Tuttle wanted something "right away" as you may recall. On thinking it over, I like "ALLIED GROUPS" better than "ALLIED ORGANIZATIONS," but whatever the group wants is ok with me.

the logo I inserted is not the greatest and I think Bruce is working on something. But the letterhead looked a little bare so I put this one in. The overlapping circles symbolize the organizations that have an area of common interest, as well as other divergent interests. The 8's lying on their sides were the closest thing to the infinity symbol that my letter set had. (The alphabets I had with more symmetrical 8's, didn't have circular O's!)

I've sent copies of this to Andre, Richard & Earle.

2. Richard checked with the Boxborough Sheraton and we decided to take July 12 and asked them to reserve the whole area and give us a quick option if anybody else wanted any part of it.

Andre called to say we should probably look into incorporation so that we can have a sounder basis for handling funds, etc. I checked with New Hampshire and they are sending me the papers for non-profit incorporation. I think New Hampshire is less expensive than Massachusetts, but we'll see what the group wants to do.

4. Andre also felt we should have By-Laws. I am sure he is right, and in any case if we incorporate we have to file by-laws. Just to make it easier for the group to have something to depart from, I drafted a rough outline. It may not appeal to anybody, but I tried to keep the organization fairly loose and flexible. 5. I called the New England Hospital Assembly because they have the most elaborate arrangements for exhibitors and booths. I thought that we could look over their prospectus for exhibitors and develop our own much simplified statement with some confidence that, going by that as a guide, we would not be overlooking anything vital. Copy enclosed.

6. Program Cover. I sent andre a gorgeous cover of a program sent out by some Republican group. A rich, not-too-dark blue, with a round circle cut out of it. The next page (glossy, of course) had a beautiful eagle with shield, etc., which was positioned beneath the open circle on the cover. Very classy!
