

AMERICA'S HOPE

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"I WILL NOT FORGET THEE"

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"Can a woman forget her sucking child, that she should not have compassion on the son of her womb? Yea, they may forget, yet will I not forget thee." (Isaiah 49:15) The previous verse identifies the people, and the land or nation that God will not forget. It states: "But Zion said, The Lord hath forsaken me, and my Lord hath forgotten me." (Isaiah 49:14)

For about fifty years or more practically every gospel preacher in this nation has preached that God has forsaken and forgotten this Zion nation. And worse than that, according to their teaching, God decreed that this nation would come under the reign of some great antichrist.

If Christian ministers and Christian churches knew who devised and formulated this futuristic theory, with some great antichrist ruling over the entire earth, they would never have accepted it and certainly never would have preached it. We will go back to verse 13 in Isaiah 49 where we read: "Sing O heavens; and be joyful, O earth; and break forth into singing, O mountains: for the Lord hath comforted his people, and will have mercy upon his afflicted." This Zion nation has been comforted by God more than any other nation in history, and we can say more than the four previous world powers combined.

This Zion nation is being afflicted. Verse 17 in Isaiah 49 states: "Thy children shall make haste; thy destroyers and they that made thee waste shall go forth of thee." It seems that the youth of this nation are already turning to Christianity and patriotism. "Thy destroyers and they that made thee waste shall go forth of thee" is a decree by the Almighty.

The God who destroyed all the wicked at the time of Noah with a flood and saved Noah and his family, the God who destroyed Sodom and Gomorrah and saved Lot, and the God who buried Pharaoh with his whole army in the Red sea, will have no difficulty in removing the destroyers and wasters from this Zion nation. In Ezekiel 20, verse 38, the Almighty states: "And I will purge out from among you the rebels, and them that transgress against me: I will bring them forth out of the country where they sojourn, and they shall not enter into the land of Israel: and ye shall know that I am the Lord." Christ made a similar decree in Luke 19:27. He stated: "But those mine enemies, which would not that I should reign over them, bring hither, and slay them before me."
