

CARDAN, Paul

Redefining Revolution (Solidarity; pam., 24 pp.) \$2.00
 Reprint of an essay arguing that most Marxist thought is irrelevant to contemporary autonomous struggles.

CASTORIADIS, Cornelius

History as Creation (Solidarity London; pam., 56 pp.) \$3.50
 Castoriadis pamphlet that argues that history is not "scientific," but instead a perception which is constantly molded by our current circumstances. Revolutionaries are those who are able to see new ways of viewing that which has been "long settled."

Workers' Councils (Philadelphia Solidarity; oversize pam., 52 pp.) \$2.50
 Presents a discussion of the modern transformation of work and a hypothetical organization of society based on a federation of councils. Castoriadis (a.k.a. Paul Cardan) was the chief theoretician of the group Socialisme ou Barbarie.

CLARK, John P.

Max Stirner's Egoism (Freedom Press; pb., 111 pp.) \$5.00
 One of the few studies of the individualist philosopher, by a leading anarchist theoretician. ISBN 0-900384-14-X

FABBRI, Luigi

Bourgeois Influences on Anarchism (See Sharp; pam., 35 pp.) \$1.50
 The first English translation of the classic anarchist text focusing on anti-organizational attitudes, abusiveness in argument, and the use of terrorist violence. An attempt to distinguish between Anarchism and Anarchy.

Untying the Knot (pamphlet, 23 pp.) \$1.00
The Tyranny of Structurelessness and *The Tyranny of Tyranny*—A debate on feminism, anarchism, and organization.

MUNIS, G. and ZERZAN, J.

Unions and Revolution (Black and Red; pam., 62 pp.) \$1.25
 Two essays concerning the authoritarian aspects of the modern, bureaucratized union.

PERLMAN, Fredy

Against His-story, Against Leviathan (Black and Red; pb., 302 pp.) \$5.00
 In his last published book before his untimely death, Fredy Perlman turns the world history upside-down and inside-out in search of liberating insights. A monumental, and yet deeply sensitive, anarchist view of civilization and its malcontents.

The Continuing Appeal of Nationalism (Black and Red; pb., 58 pp.) \$2.50
 Conservative nationalism and revolutionary nationalism—despite several proclamations of their death in this century, they continue to survive. This was Fredy's last blistering essay, before his death.

The Reproduction of Daily Life (Black and Red; pam., 24 pp.) \$1.00
 How workers are alienated by capital and thus reproduce the capitalist system in their daily lives.

The Strait: Book of Obenabi—His Songs (Black and Red; pb., 400 pp.) \$7.00
 Tracing the history of the inhabitants of the woodlands around the Strait (now Detroit) from pre-history to the 1830's, the book examines the encroachment of European Civilization from the perspective of the victims rather than the victors. Concentrates on the variety of forms that resistance to the Invader took.

PYM, Denis

The Employment Question and Other Essays (Freedom Press; pb., 68 pp.) \$4.50
 "Full employment" can no longer be sustained. We must locate the responsibility and authority for organization in ourselves, and we can use technology for that end. Pym argues that a life of leisure and enjoyable self-employed work is the only sensible goal. ISBN 0-900384-31-X
