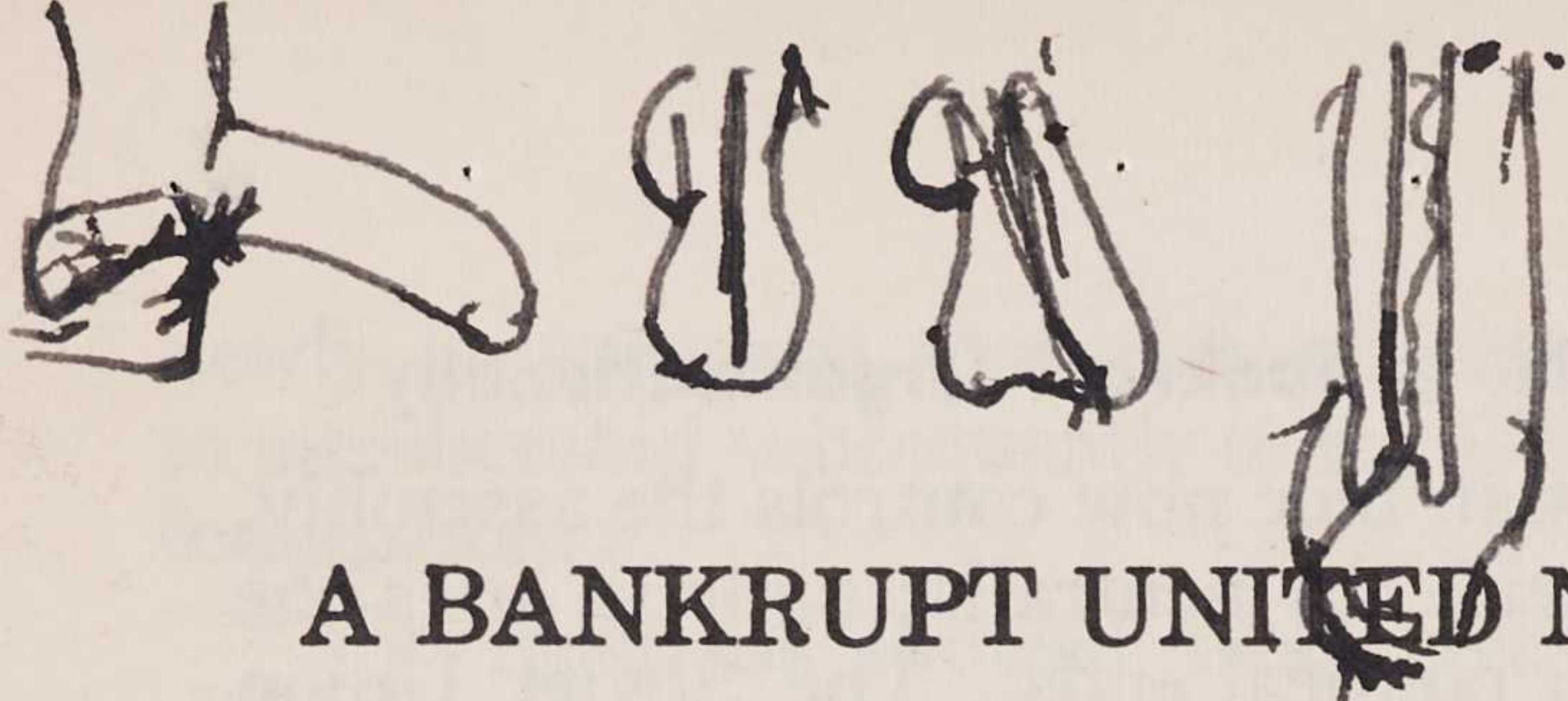




A BANKRUPT UNITED NATIONS

The United Nations is in trouble, serious trouble. It is most essential that every freedom-loving American reappraise the United Nations. Founded in 1945, it has not been able to deal basically with the East and West conflict because of the heat of the "cold war." Nehru's grab of Goa, U. N. aggression against anti-Communist Katanga, Russia's refusal to pay U. N. obligations, the United States' willingness to pay the U. N.'s bills, the Red conspiracy in U. N. headquarters, the blackmail and trade in admission of Outer Mongolia, the struggle to admit Red China, and many other situations demand realistic reappraisal. Actually, the U. N. is bankrupt.

1. The U. N. Is Bankrupt Morally

A double standard of morality applies to all U. N. activity. The attack upon imperialism does not apply to Soviet imperialism!

This moral delinquency and inherent dishonesty is involved in the dual use of such words as "peace" and "democracy."

The U. N. has been morally bankrupt from the beginning. It is impossible to adopt a charter that says that its member nations are "to practice tolerance and live together in peace with one another as good neighbors" and to include the Communists who know nothing of tolerance and whose program of peace is world victory for socialism. It is impossible for the U. N. to say that all of its nations "unite our strength to maintain international peace and security," while the Soviet Union uses the U. N. headquarters as its major citadel for subversion. Moral decadence has brought the United Nations to its present impasse.
