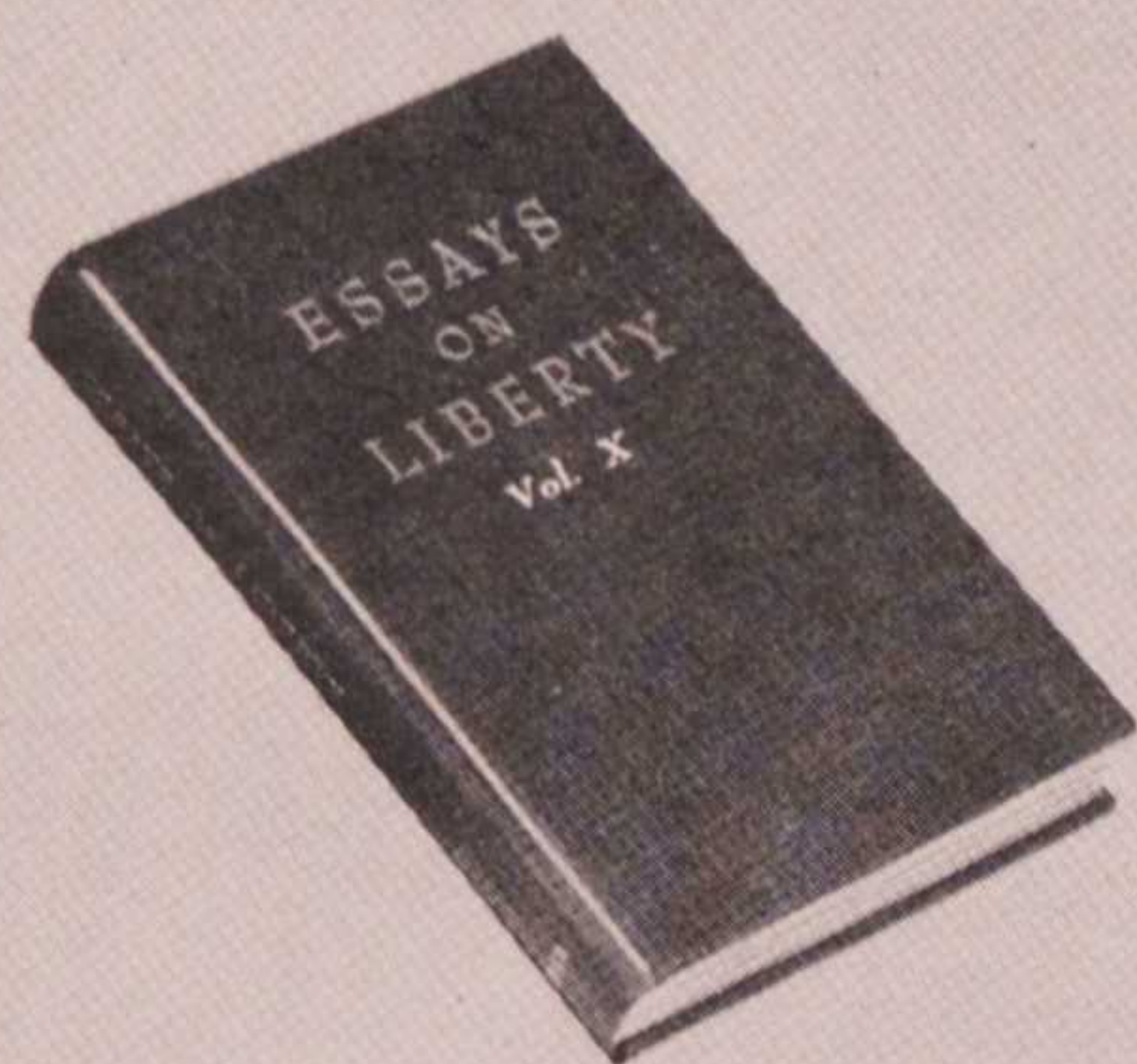


Essays on Liberty

Periodically, the Foundation assembles for release in book form outstanding selections from its previously published articles. The subjects include government, taxes, inflation, money, monopoly, price controls, subsidies, security, competition, and other topics of current importance analyzed by accomplished exponents, past and present, of the libertarian philosophy. This is a growing shelf of the literature of liberty, applied to current problems, in terms familiar to the layman.

The first volume (37 selections, 308 pages) was published in 1952. Subsequent volumes, of 448 pages each, have appeared at the rate of one a year since 1954. Volume X, released in September 1963, includes selections from *The Freeman* and other Foundation releases during the year ended March 31, 1963. Each volume is indexed.

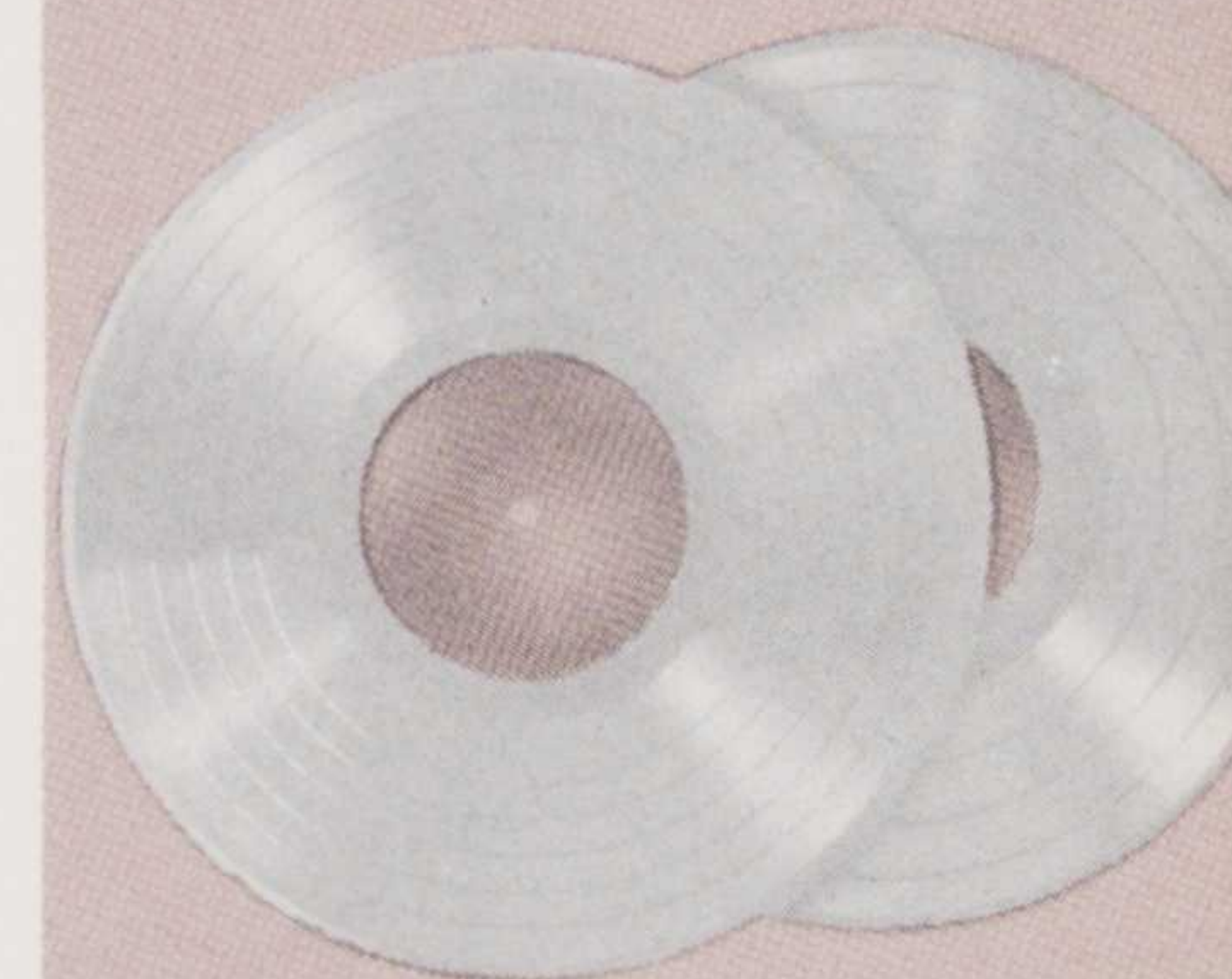


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
